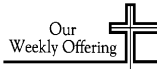

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**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL**

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**Most Holy Trinity/La Santísima Trinidad**

All the gifts that we receive from God, be it His grace, faith, hope, peace, justification, they are bestowed upon us through the Blessed Trinity. It is by the grace of God through the power of the Holy Spirit in the Most Holy Name of Jesus that God manifests His love in us, with us and through us so His light may shine in the world. Today's Gospel Reading from the Gospel of John reaffirms the three fold action of the Blessed Trinity in our lives. Both, the Father and the Son have sent the Holy Spirit in the world as the Spirit of truth to guide us into the truth. As Jesus did not speak of His own, but spoke of what He heard from the Father, the Holy Spirit also will not speak on His own, but he speaks of what He hears. During the Gospel Reading, we heard Jesus say, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now." From these words, we learn that while "Revelation is already complete in Jesus Christ, it has not been made completely explicit; it remains for Christian faith gradually to grasp its full significance over the course of the centuries." (C.C.C. # 66) As we are able to grasp the truth, depending on our age and our openness to the knowledge and understanding of Scriptures, the grace of God shines on us according to our need and our desire to grow in Christ. Such a grace may be manifested by the Holy Spirit who may choose to inspire us, guide us to written teachings of the Catholic Church, or possibly put on our path a loving teacher who will explain to us what we seek to learn for the glory of God. My brothers and sisters, before proceeding with the celebration of the Holy Mass, I would like to ask you to take the time this week to reflect upon the Blessed Trinity. May God will bless you always.

Es por la gracia de Dios, en el poder del Espíritu Santo, y por el Santísimo nombre de Jesús, que Dios manifiesta su amor en nosotros y a través de nosotros, para que su amor brille en el mundo.

En el evangelio de hoy de San Juan, se reafirma la triple acción de la Santísima Trinidad en nuestra vida. El padre y el Hijo, ambos han enviado al Espíritu Santo al mundo como el espíritu de verdad que nos guía hacia la verdad. Como Jesús no hablaba de si mismo, sino de lo que había oído decir al padre, así mismo el Espíritu Santo no habla de si mismo, si de lo que ha escuchado. Durante la lectura del Evangelio hemos escuchado a Cristo decir, "Tengo muchas cosas que deciros, pero no podéis con ellas ahora." De estas palabras aprendemos que mientras "La revelación se ha completado en Jesucristo; esta (la revelación) se deja para la fe del cristiano que agarre todo su sentido durante el paso los siglos." (CCC #66). Dependiendo de nuestra edad, de nuestra apertura al conocimiento y entendimiento de la sagrada escritura, la Gracia de Dios en nosotros, y de acuerdo a nuestra necesidad y deseo de crecer en Cristo, podemos alcanzar el conocimiento de la verdad. Tal Gracia, puede ser manifestada por el Espíritu Santo que puede inspirarnos, y guiarnos a las enseñanzas de la Iglesia Católica, o posiblemente ponga en nuestro camino a alguien que nos explique lo que estamos buscando aprender de Dios. Así que mis queridos hermanos reflexionemos durante esta semana sobre este misterio del amor de Dios que es la Santísima Trinidad. Que Dios los bendiga a todos ustedes.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Today's feast, extending a dimension of Easter joy into Ordinary Time, reminds us that every aspect of worship centers on the mystery of God in three persons. At baptism, we are initiated into Christ and the Spirit. The Creed we recite at Mass every Sunday has its roots in the ancient celebration of baptism, when a new believer was questioned at the edge of the waters of the font with three questions: Do you believe in God, the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit? Three questions, three affirmations, three immersions into the saving waters. Because every liturgy abounds with references to the Trinity, not only in words but in blessings by the sign of the cross, this feast was not easily accepted into the calendar. Pope Alexander in the eleventh century remarked that the liturgy is so laden with praise of the Trinity that there was no need for a special feast. Two hundred years later, while in exile in France, Pope John XXII proclaimed the feast, but it was not until 1911 that Pope St. Pius X gave it status as a solemnity.

A favorite image in art for today is the Icon of the Trinity, showing three glorious winged men seated at a table laden with bread and a cup of wine. It recalls Abraham's hospitality to angels and gives expression to the inner life of God, a life lived in relationship, a life poured out in abundance whenever Christians gather at the table of the Eucharist to give praise to the Father, in Christ, in the embrace of the Spirit.

**TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE**

Hoy celebramos la Pascua de Pentecostés. Esta es una de las tres Pascuas que celebramos los cristianos. Las otras dos son la Pascua de Resurrección (o Pascua Florida) y la Pascua del Nacimiento de Jesús. Estas tres solemnidades cristianas celebran tres momentos claves en el plan de salvación: la Encarnación del Verbo Divino (Jesús), su Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección y el descenso de su Espíritu Santo sobre la Iglesia. Pascua viene siendo el nombre de la principal solemnidad del calendario judío y recuerda la liberación del pueblo de Israel de la esclavitud. Los cristianos hemos tomado ese nombre por reconocernos como descendientes de Abraham y porque en nuestras tres Pascuas celebramos que Jesús viene a salvarnos, o sea, a liberarnos del pecado y sus consecuencias tanto personales como sociales. En muchas partes el título de Pascua se ha dejado para hablar de la Fiesta de la Navidad y la Fiesta de Pentecostés. Esto es una lástima ya que el recordar la Pascua debe impulsar al cristiano a obrar por la liberación de todos para que el mundo se salve por Jesucristo.
