**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL**

**Thirteenth Sunday OT/ Decimo Tercer Domingo TO**

I will follow you where ever you go! This is what the first young man of today's Gospel said to Jesus. And Jesus told him: "The foxes have dens, and the birds of the sky nests, but the Son of the man, has no place to rest his head..." If we pay close attention to the Synoptic Gospels, we will realize that Jesus is always moving, he never stops to rest. The only place in the whole Gospel where Jesus rests is on the Cross, when he handed over his spirit to his Father. Is this what you want? Ask Jesus, this is the invitation he makes to the first young man, if you want to follow me to the Cross, because that is the only place where I can rest, and if you follow me to the cross you'll rest too. To the second young man of today's gospel, Jesus calls him, and this man ask him to go and bury his father, and Christ told him: "let the dead bury their dead." By saying this Jesus is telling the man, let those who believed that they are alive, but are dead, because they do not believed in Jesus Christ, buried their dead. This is a call to abandon the idols, mainly money, and possessions. The father is the one who hands down the inheritance to his children. Because money and possessions make you to live for yourself, and they bring you to be alone and to the death of your being. So Christ is calling this man to follow the one who will give him life eternal. And there is a third man. This man, is asking Jesus to say farewell to his family, and Jesus is telling him that those who allow affections to interfere with the vocation, the calling to follow him, is not worthy of the kingdom of God. So my brothers and sisters, to which class of men we belong? To those making great efforts, with a enormous dedication, but reject the cross, and sufferings, to those who look for riches and fame, to be recognized, or to the third group, those who prefer human affection to the love of God. Because Christ is looking for workers, as today's gospel says at the beginning. Jesus is preparing himself for his passion, and for this reason he sends his disciples to preach in pairs, to bring the "Good News," to tell the people that the Kingdom of God is coming. This word of today must call us to conversion, so we can say like the prophet: "I am here, send me." May God bless you always.

¡Te seguiré donde quiera que vayas Señor! Esto es lo que le dice el primer Joven del Evangelio de hoy a Cristo. Y este le responde: "Las zorras tiene guaridas y las aves del cielo nidos, pero el hijo del hombre no tiene donde reclinar la cabeza..." Si le prestamos mucha atención a los evangelios Sinópticos nos daremos cuenta de que Cristo siempre esta en movimiento, nunca se detiene, solo descansa en la cruz, cuando entrega su espíritu al Padre. Por que esta es la invitación, es como si hubiera dicho Cristo a este Joven, "Mira, yo solo descansaré en la Cruz, ¿Eso es lo que quieres tu? A otro, Cristo lo llama y este le contesta, que lo deje primero que lo deje enterrar a su padre, y Cristo le dice: "Deja que los muertos, entierren a sus muertos..." Si Cristo te llama, deja que los que están muertos, los que No-Creen, pero piensan que están vivos, entierren a los muertos. Deja los ídolos, el padre es el que te deja la herencia, el dinero, que solo te lleva a vivir para ti, a la muerte de tu ser, a estar solo, todo esto solo te llevará a la muerte, y sigue al que vive para siempre. Y hay un tercero, que al oír la llamada le pide al Señor despedirse de su familia, los afectos, el cariño, el que dirán, pero el Señor dice, que el que pone la mano en el arado y mira para atrás, para ver lo que ha dejado no es digno del Reino de los cielos. Entonces mis hermanos, ¿a que clase pertenecemos?, a los voluntariosos, que se esfuerzan, pero no quieren la cruz y se escandalizan del sufrimiento, y esto puede traer consecuencias terribles. A los que buscan el dinero y la fama, o la gloria, y les van los títulos y reconocimientos, o al tercer grupo que se mueve por los afectos, por el que me quieran más que seguir al Señor. Por que Cristo esta buscando obreros para su mies, como dice al principio del evangelio hoy, el Señor se estaba preparando para su pasión, y por eso iba a enviar a sus discípulos de dos en dos para evangelizar, para llevar la buena noticia de que "El reino de Dios has llegado ya." Esta palabra de hoy nos debe calar bien hondo y llamarnos a conversión, para que así podamos decir como el profeta Isaías: "Aquí estoy Señor, envíame." Que Dios me los bendiga a todos.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Processions are life's journey distilled. We move with companions, aware that Christ accompanies us, as we move to the altar for Communion or to the font for baptism, or carry a loved one to a place of rest. In Europe, the season of pilgrimage is beginning now, and tens of thousands of people are moving by foot on well-worn paths. Some take as long as six weeks to walk the last few hundred miles of the medieval pilgrimage route to the Shrine of St. James the Apostle in Compostella, in northern Spain.

Those who make the journey by foot, hiking, or by bicycle, have a kind of passport stamped at villages and monasteries on the road. When they present this document at the cathedral, they are given the emblem of a pilgrim, the scallop shell of St. James. High over their heads at Mass, a huge botafumero twirls clouds of sweet incense through the cathedral. Cynics say it is to mask the odor of smelly feet. The pilgrims know better. Seeing through the clouds the happy faces of those they met along the road, they recognize a foretaste of the welcome into heaven, and the joy of meeting loved ones in the Kingdom of God.

Allí él les contó su vida pecaminosa y su deseo de encontrar un Miserere (Salmo 51) digno de expiar sus pecados ante Dios. Le contaron del Miserere del Monte que cantaban durante la noche los monjes difuntos de un Monasterio que había sido destruido siglos atrás. El músico afanado por encontrar su Miserere, corrió a la montaña donde escuchó aquel lamentoso y bello canto. Al regresar a la Abadía intentó escribir la música de aquel Miserere, pero lo único que logro fue volverse loco. Aquel pobre hombre murió sin reconocer que cada quien debe entonar a su manera su propio y pobre Miserere mei (piedad de mi). Dios no nos perdona por la belleza o la fuerza de nuestra confesión, sino por su amor y su misericordia.
