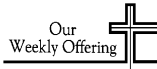

**WEEKLY HOMILY / HOMILÍA SEMANAL****Fourteenth Sunday OT/Decimo Cuarto Domingo T.O.**

Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light.” This Sunday gospel is an invitation to rest, this desire of rest is always in our hearts but we never manage to enjoy in fullness. If we think about that, how many times we say:” today I am going to do nothing” and we try so hard without any success. We always have things to do: clean the garage, the garden, fix the car, do some shopping, etc. or in the other hand all our worries, perhaps we need to pay bills or go to a doctors visit or something else or maybe the famous sentence “when I retired”...wherever the case may be the truth is we are lacking rest, and the obvious consequence we find ourselves labor and burdened, that happen to us even if we are in vacations, for this reason we need other vacations to recover from the first . All this affects us very much and often do not know why we are in a bad mood or angry, the answer is simple fatigue is accumulated over many months. Here is the secret that Christ wants to be unveiled today for us, “Come to me all you who labor and burden, and I will give you rest” then we must ask: today I am tired and overwhelmed? I want to find rest? If the answer is yes let us draw near to Christ. And What I have to do to find the desired break? Christ reveals to us: “Take my yoke upon you and learn from me” Which is the yoke of Christ? To do God’s will at all times, but for this we need the qualities of Christ,” For I am meek and humble of heart” . Dear Brothers and sisters that is what separates us from the desired rest, “I am”. We think we are God, I can, and I have to be able to do this or that, what they will think of me if I do not? Etc... This is called pride and is a mortal sin. For this the Lord invites us to put God first, as the saying goes very true in Spanish,” Man proposes, God disposes.” To say this is all I want to do Lord, but you will be done, if it goes well and if not then also, blessed be God. This is the true Christian the one who see the will of God in every moment and accepted and find the real rest, the one who do everything putting God in the first place , so if everything goes as planned well and no matter if not, is God who brings the history. Let ask to our Lord Jesus Christ to receive this gift of his will all the days of our life. God blessed you always.

“Venid a mi vosotros todos que estáis cansados y agobiados, que Yo os aliviare. Tomad sobre vosotros mi yugo y aprended de mi que soy humilde y manso de corazón, y hallaréis descanso para vuestras almas, por que mi yugo es suave y mi carga ligera.” El evangelio de este domingo nos esta invitando al descanso, eso que todos nosotros y no podemos disfrutar nunca, ya que aunque nos lo proponemos nunca lo logramos. Sino analicémoslo. Cuantas veces hemos decidido, “Hoy no voy a hacer nada.” Y por mucho que lo intentamos, no lo logramos, siempre hay algo que hacer, limpiar el garaje, o el jardín, o arreglar el carro, o hacer las compras que hemos estado posponiendo, etc. Y sino,. Las preocupaciones, que si hay que pagar esto, o ir al doctor por que algo sucede, o no se que cosa. Y sino aquella famosa proposición, “Cuando me jubile...” Lo que sea, el resultado es que no descansamos, y como consecuencia nos encontramos cansados y fatigados, incluso si salimos de vacaciones, necesitamos otras vacaciones para recuperarnos de las primeras. Todo esto nos afecta muchísimo, y muchas veces no sabemos por que estamos malhumorados o enfadados, y es muy simple es la fatiga acumulada durante muchos meses. He aquí el secreto que Cristo nos quiere desvelar hoy, “Venid ami los que estáis cansados y agobiados que Yo os aliviare.” Entonces debemos preguntarnos, ¿estoy cansado y agobiado hoy? ¿Quiero encontrar el descanso? Si la respuesta es SI, acerquémonos a Cristo. Y ¿que debo de hacer para encontrar el deseado descanso? Muy fácil, Cristo nos lo revela, “Tomad mi yugo y aprended de mi...” ¿Cual es el yugo de Cristo? Hacer la voluntad de Dios en todo momento, pero para esto necesitamos las cualidades de Cristo, “Que soy manso y humilde de corazón.” Por que mis queridos hermanos, esto es lo que nos separa del descanso tan deseado, “Yo soy.” El creernos dioses, yo lo puedo, yo tengo que ser capaz de hacer esto o aquello, que pensarán de mi sino lo hago, etc. Esto se llama orgullo, y es un pecado mortal. Por esto el Señor, nos invita a poner a Dios primero, como dice un dicho español muy cierto, “El hombre propone y Dios dispone.” Es decir, todo esto es lo que deseo hacer Señor, pero que sea tu voluntad, si sale bien y sino, pues también, bendito sea Dios. Este es el Cristiano, hermanos, el que ve encada momento y acepta la voluntad de Dios, y así puede descansar, por que lo hace todo poniendo a Dios primero, así si sale todo como había planeado bien, y sino no importa es Dios quien lleva la historia. Pidamos a nuestro señor Jesucristo recibir hoy esta gracia, la de hacer la voluntad de Dios todos los días de nuestra vida. Que Dios me los bendiga siempre.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

With the Reformation, some early Protestants, including the “Anabaptists,” rejected infant baptism in favor of “believer’s baptism.” Against Orthodox and Catholic practice, which favored baptism as soon as possible for a newborn, these movements desired that the candidate for baptism speak for him- or herself at a mature age, not through godparents as an infant. Today, it is clear that they were rejecting a very ancient practice (even as early as the second century) of baptizing children of all ages. Children came first in ancient baptismal ceremonies, and someone would speak for them. Gregory of Nazianzen wanted to delay the baptism of children to three years of age, since at that age they could retain at least some impression of the liturgy. He made an exception for the very ill, who were to be baptized ahead of the annual Easter baptism. That means that infants and children were normally baptized together with adults, and that everyone received confirmation and the Eucharist. The tone of the early bishops’ writings is generous and compassionate, and seeks to build up the eucharistic assembly by widely celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit. If a priest celebrated baptism, then the gift of the Spirit was postponed for the bishop, but with no regard for the person’s age. So, until the fifth century, confirmation was for infants, too.

Doña María había recibido como herencia por parte de su hermano Antonio una pintura de la Virgen del Rosario en tan mal estado que no se podía distinguir ni la Virgen madre con el niño Dios en sus brazos o los santos Antonio de Padova y Andrés apóstol. No obstante la mala condición de la pintura, doña María la colocó en su capilla donde pasaba las mañanas en oración. Un día, una indígena y su niño pasaban por la puerta de la capilla cuando notaron un gran brillo que venía del rostro de María iluminando el resto del cuadro con colores vivos y brillantes. Inmediatamente llamaron a doña María, quien pudo ser testigo de la milagrosa renovación. Como algo muy interesante, la imagen de cerca se ve borrosa y dañada, pero de lejos adquiere distinción y nitidez.
