Connect the rhymes



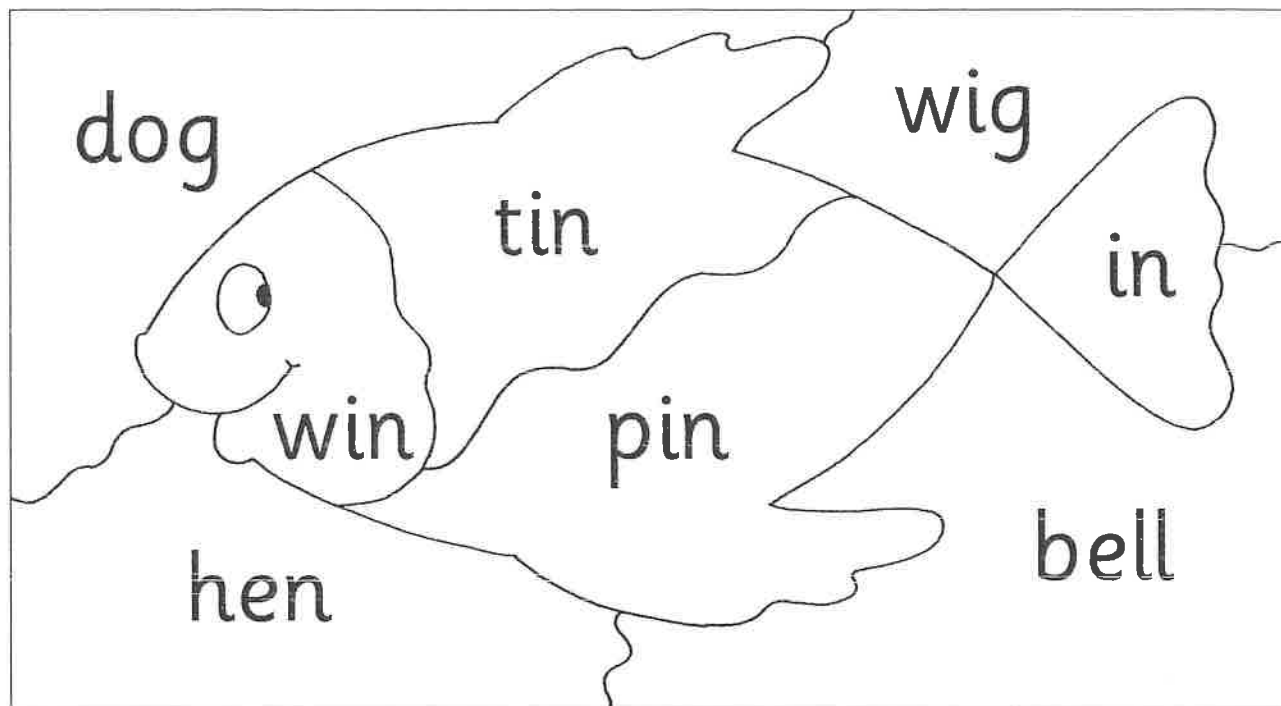
