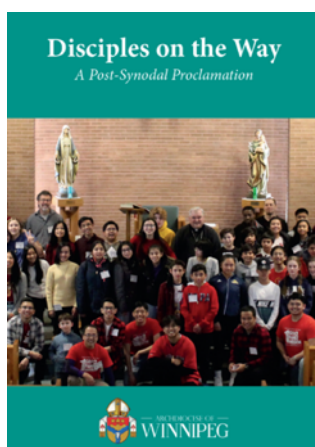

Archbishop Richard Gagnon recently released (at Pentecost) the post-synodal document, *Disciples on the Way*. This document outlines the challenges and opportunities which our first Archdiocesan Synod has placed before us. The Archbishop encourages all of us “to read the document, to pray over it, to ponder it and to join with their fellow parishioners to implement it in their various parish communities.” We will be reconstituting the membership of our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) over the summer months. The members of the PPC, with additional volunteers as needed, will work with the Pastor to discern and prepare an action plan for our parish to respond to various priorities outlined by the Synod.

ALL MEMBERS OF THE PARISH are invited to pick up a copy of *Disciples on the Way* and to find some time to read it over the summer months.

In the fall, the Archdiocese will be providing orientation sessions and further guidance regarding Synod implementation. Around that time our PPC will set a time to gather for a formal meeting.
