Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

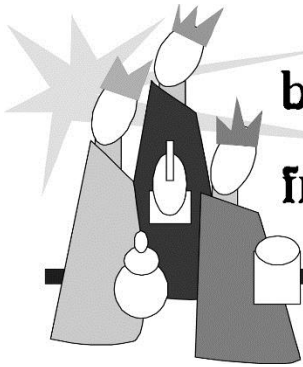
