A letter opener is a great invention. Even the smallest opening is an opportunity for the opener to slip through. Its purpose is to help reveal the contents of the letter. What looked at first to be a bill might turn out to be a refund check. So, with one small opening the opener helps reveal the true contents of the letter. The Word of God is like that with the human heart. When the Word confronts us, we can be surprised at how he can open the contents of our hearts. Deep within is the place where he probes into our thoughts and treasures. He can open the envelope of our lives and reveal if it is a love letter or something else altogether. The rich young man in today's gospel finds this out very quickly as Jesus opens the envelope of his life and reveals the letter written in his heart. "All these things I have observed from my youth" is what he says on the outside. Jesus, the letter opener, "looked at him and loved him", opening gently and revealing what was written on his heart. After reading what is in the heart Jesus instructs, he teaches. The only thing remaining is that final thing you hold on to, rid yourself of it and you will be free to follow him completely—that's how you get to heaven is by following him. See how the truth of the man's heart is revealed. He went away sad because he had many possessions. He could not easily let go of his wealth. He was simply too attached. He held on to his wealth and was sad. What are we holding on to? Can we let go and be filled with joy at knowing heaven as our greatest treasure?
