FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Pastoral Reflection

How does my faith bring me joy?

Pope Francis wrote in his pastoral exhortation, *Joy of the Gospel*, "I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ, or at least an openness to letting Him encounter them; I ask all of you to do this unflinchingly each day."

Pope Francis listed his recipe for happiness in 2014.

1. Live and let live, that is the first step towards peace and joy.
2. Give oneself to others.
3. The capacity to move with kindness and humility, the peaceful oasis of life. Old people have this wisdom; they are the memory of a nation. A nation that does not look after its old people has no future.
4. Play with children.
5. Spend Sundays with your family.
6. Help young people find employment—bringing bread home is what gives you dignity.
7. Look after nature. We have to look after creation and we are not doing it. It is one of the greatest challenges we have.
8. Quickly forgetting what is negative is healthy.
9. Respect those who think differently. The Church grows by attraction, not by proselytism.
10. Actively seek peace. Peace at times gives the impression of stillness, but it is never stillness, it is always active peace.

When our new Archbishop, Cardinal-designate Joseph Tobin, spoke at his introductory press conference, he outlined his vision for his tenure as Archbishop. He elaborated on the qualities the Archdiocese will need and he will promote. The first quality described was JOY. "I am not talking about a sort of superficial giddiness but rather the 'joy which we experience daily, amid the little things of life, as a response to the loving invitation of God our Father,' the joy that was promised us by Jesus, joy that is the fruit of the Holy Spirit."

These messages give us plenty to reflect on as begin the season of Advent and the joyous celebration of Our Savior's birth.

*Help me prepare a way for you to enter my life decisively, Lord:
A way for you to take me as your own,
To summon out what I shall be,
To become what you call me to be.
In the quiet of my prayer, Lord,
Help me clear a path for You
To walk into my heart, into my day.*



THE IMPORTANCE OF DEVOTIONS

Popular devotions are expressions of love and fidelity that promote the faith of the people. They are an invaluable means of promoting an increased love of God. The **First Friday** devotion is associated with the Sacred Heart of Jesus and **First Saturday** is associated with the Immaculate Heart of Mary. They are like a novena performed over months instead of days for reparations to Our Lord. The next celebrations are December 2 and 3.
