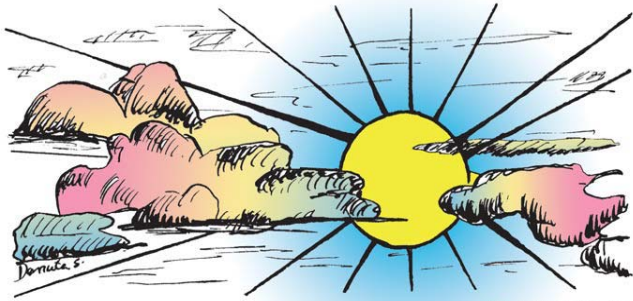

THE HOPE AND PROMISE OF REDEMPTION

The prophet Jeremiah prophesies the end of the Babylonian exile. He describes how the weak and sorrowful people now return with joy. These are the scattered people of God: the blind and the lame, the mothers and pregnant women. They shall be led along an easy road so that no one will stumble. The Lord's kindness and mercy are on all these weak and broken people.

Here and in Psalm 126 we find the most lovely poetic images of God's love and care for us. "Those that sow in tears / shall reap rejoicing. Although they go forth weeping, / carrying the seed to be sown, / they shall come back rejoicing, / carrying their sheaves" (Psalm 126:5-6). Although God had to punish Israel for their many sins, God never forgot them, scattered as they were, and brings them all back to the land of their ancestors, there to flourish and be joyful again. Note from Pastor:

As we near the end of October, our liturgical calendar invites us to remember those who have died. On November 1st we celebrate **All Saints Day**. This is the day to celebrate with the saints... those who have finished the race of this earthly life as victors and now live with the Lord forever in heaven. Throughout the year we remember the canonized saints on their feast days, but on November 1 we celebrate with all whose names we do not know but who have won the crown of glory. All Saints is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have Mass as follows:
Wednesday, Oct. 31 at 6:00pm at Infant Jesus and St. Mark
Thursday, Nov. 1 at 6:30am, 8:30am, and 6pm at Infant Jesus
8am and 5pm at St. Mark's

On November 2 we observe **All Souls Day**. This is the day to pray for all who have died and are undergoing the final purification in purgatory. The bible tells us it is a good and holy thought to pray for the dead (2nd Macabees 12:39-45). All Souls Day is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but all are encouraged to come and pray for our departed loved ones. We will have Mass for All Souls Day as follows:

Friday, Nov. 2 at 8:30am and 6pm at Infant Jesus
6pm at St. Mark's


