

# ST. VINCENT'S BOARD

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Since 1895, St. Vincent's Home has cared for children. As an orphanage, as a relocation center for displaced youngsters, as a residential treatment center for emotionally disabled adolescents, and as a child-placing agency through Catholic Charities, St. Vincent's Home helped children in need.

In 1973, the board of St. Vincent's Home changed the focus of its child care effort, closed the institution and determined to broaden its services. It established the St. Vincent's Home, which makes grants to organizations whose mission is consistent with that history.

The St. Vincent's Home board, whose members are appointed by the bishop, meet once a year in October. The Bishop also can remove any director with or without cause. At the October meeting the board reviews and approve St. Vincent's grant applications.

The Board of Directors is compose by the Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Davenport, the Vicar General, the Chancellor, the Director of Social Action and Catholic Charities, two Priests, five Lay people, and three Sisters of said Diocese and ex officials.

Term of Office. Except for the Bishop of the Diocese of Davenport, the Vicar General, the Chancellor, and the Director of Social Action and Catholic Charities, each board members serves three years and may be renewable for one more three-year term. After two full terms, a Director should be off one year prior to returning to the Board.
