Dear St. Rose Family,

St. Rose of Lima, Isabel de Flores, grew up in Lima, Peru, where she was born in 1586. Isabel developed a talent for gardening, so it is not surprising that she took the name “Rose” as her confirmation name. As she tended the flowers in her family garden, she prayed. Her relationship with God was the most important thing in her life.

Rose’s parents hoped that she would get married, but Rose wanted to give her life completely to God. She told her parents that her dream was to join the convent to become a nun, but they would not give her permission. They needed Rose at home, helping to support the family.

Rose moved into a hut in the garden. She earned money by selling her flowers during the day. At night she did needlework, making designs with colorful threads on cloth. People bought the clothing she decorated. With the money she earned, Rose helped her family and also bought food for the needy people in her community. She put her prayers into action. With help from her brother, she added rooms to her hut and cared for homeless children and the elderly. She became a much-loved woman everywhere in her country.

When people complimented her beauty, Rose cut her hair and rubbed pepper on her face so that she would not be noticed for her appearance. While she never became a nun, she took vows for the Third Order of St. Dominic and remained chaste through her life.

Rose did not take good care of her own health. She did not sleep enough and she did not eat properly. These sacrifices shortened her life of service to Jesus and her neighbor. When she died in 1617, she was just 31 years old, and people from all over Lima came to her funeral Mass to thank God for filling Rose with love for all people.

She was canonized in 1667. We honor Rose of Lima on August 23. She was the first person from the New World—the Americas—to be named a saint, and she is today the patroness of Latin America and the Philippines, as well as of gardeners and florists. **Rose’s life teaches us to reach out to our neighbor and to use our talents to help them live better lives.**

ST. ROSE SUNDAY ENCOUNTER

Returning to Mass: We are living in unprecedented times. Never in most of our lives here in the United States, have we had any restrictions on access to attending Mass every single day, if we chose to. Our spiritual support and anchor effected by limiting attending Mass and receiving the Holy Eucharist has been devastating for so many. Yet, in God’s great care and Love for us he continues providing many ways and opportunities to still (in spite of the pandemic) have access to Mass and the Eucharist. As you know, we have opened back up to daily Mass and our normal weekend Mass schedule. While we are somewhat limited in the number of people at any one Mass, we also have been able to utilize the Satellite location and live video stream Mass to the Satellite, where communion is brought to us. No one who has wanted to attend Mass has been turned away. As St. Pope John Paul II said “Be Not Afraid”. As a reminder, to insure your safety we sanitize the sanctuary after each Mass, request everyone

wear a mask, and have marked out the social distancing locations to sit in the Church. If you are feeling ill, please postpone coming to Mass.

Live stream weekend Mass continues at 5:30pm on Saturdays. The Mass will remain recorded in our [Facebook video library](#) or on our [website](#).

Should we run into technical difficulties, **we will make a post on Facebook to let you know Mass is being recorded and will be reposted within the hour.** Thank you for your patience as we manage technical issues to the best of our ability.

SVDP AT ST. ROSE

The St. Rose Conference of St. Vincent de Paul started in 1931...88 years ago. As Vincentians, we are asked to serve the poor within the boundaries of our Parish. This may include people who are experiencing material poverty caused by unemployment, sickness or disability, other social conditions or social poverty caused by aging, loneliness, or isolation. We have a motto: "No work of Charity is foreign to the Society."

These are the things we do:

- Make home deliveries of food several days per week
- Pay for utilities and/or rent when requested
- Offer fresh produce, bread, eggs, meat, etc. to our friends at Hollywood East, where most of our clients reside, every Wednesday in a shopping style Fresh Food Pantry feeding 45-65 people weekly
- Offer non-perishable goods like soup, sauces, pasta, canned veggies, fruits, juices, and health and bath aids to our friends at HWE every Thursday in a shopping style pantry feeding 40-50 people weekly.
- Organize and implement the annual St. Rose Food Drive in November.
- Organize, implement, and deliver Christmas food boxes to over 100 families needing assistance.
- Offering financial support to other conferences needing financial support.

Annually, we, as Vincentians, are asked to renew our commitment to:

- Witness to Jesus's boundless love for the poor, the lonely, the suffering and deprived, those without faith and those who feel unloved.
- Firmly resolve to treasure warm friendship and unity within the Society
- Seek and find the forgotten, the suffering or the deprived so that we can bring them Christ's love
- Be generous with our time, our possessions, and ourselves in our mission of charity.

At St. Rose we feed approximately 400-500 people each month. In December that number swells with the distribution of over 100 food boxes to families in Portland. We also provide rent or utilities assistance when our budget allows. At this time both our cupboards and coffers are getting pretty bare. Please consider donating food items for our pantry or cash/check in the attached envelope so that we may continue to support the poor in our neighborhood. The back of this flyer lists suggested donations for every week of the year. Of course, anything on the list at any time is also much appreciated! Thank you for your past and continued support of this important mission at St. Rose. May God bless each of you!
