Dear St. Rose family,

This week, we continue to contemplate desolation as we review the seventh and eighth rules that St. Ignatius gives us:

**Seventh Rule.** Let him who is in desolation consider how the Lord has left him in trial in his natural powers, in order to resist the different agitations and temptations of the enemy; since he can resist with the divine help, which always remains to him, though he does not clearly perceive it: because the Lord has taken from him his great fervor, great love and intense grace, leaving him, however, grace enough for eternal salvation.

**Eighth Rule.** Let him who is in desolation labor to be in patience, which is contrary to the vexations which come to him: and let him think that he will soon be consoled, employing against the desolation the devices, as is said in the sixth rule.

And so, my brothers and sisters, if we can persevere even in the pain of spiritual darkness or desolation, St. Ignatius tells us we can actually come out stronger on the other side. Remember that even in pain, the Lord is walking with us. When we do this, we experience much more grace and can even find great insights during these periods. Patience, therefore, becomes an incredible tool in navigating desolation, hearing the Lord's voice and ultimately in seeking consolation.

May the Lord continue to bless you all on this journey,

### **STORK CLUB MINISTRY HIGHLIGHT**

Stork Club is a St. Rose ministry that supports marriage and family life by bringing meals to families with new babies, or those who are suffering due to illness. We bring meals to parish families after the baby is born. We take turns bringing one to three dinners a week for about three months. This offers new parents a much-needed break from cooking and shopping and gives the volunteers a chance to visit our newest little brothers and sisters at St. Rose...even if from a distance for now.

Meals can be home-cooked or store-bought. They're delivered ready-to-eat at dinner time to the family's home. Stork Club volunteers use the online scheduling service [mealtrain.com](http://mealtrain.com) to coordinate meal delivery for a family.

# SVDP AT ST. ROSE

The St. Rose Conference of St. Vincent de Paul started in 1931...88 years ago. As Vincentians, we are asked to serve the poor within the boundaries of our Parish. This may include people who are experiencing material poverty caused by unemployment, sickness or disability, other social conditions or social poverty caused by aging, loneliness, or isolation. We have a motto: "No work of Charity is foreign to the Society."

These are the things we do:

- Make home deliveries of food several days per week
- Pay for utilities and/or rent when requested
- Offer fresh produce, bread, eggs, meat, etc. to our friends at Hollywood East, where most of our clients reside, every Wednesday in a shopping style Fresh Food Pantry feeding 45-65 people weekly
- Offer non-perishable goods like soup, sauces, pasta, canned veggies, fruits, juices, and health and bath aids to our friends at HWE every Thursday in a shopping style pantry feeding 40-50 people weekly.
- Organize and implement the annual St. Rose Food Drive in November.
- Organize, implement, and deliver Christmas food boxes to over 100 families needing assistance.
- Offering financial support to other conferences needing financial support.

Annually, we, as Vincentians, are asked to renew our commitment to:

- Witness to Jesus's boundless love for the poor, the lonely, the suffering and deprived, those without faith and those who feel unloved.
- Firmly resolve to treasure warm friendship and unity within the Society
- Seek and find the forgotten, the suffering or the deprived so that we can bring them Christ's love
- Be generous with our time, our possessions, and ourselves in our mission of charity.

At St. Rose we feed approximately 400-500 people each month. In December that number swells with the distribution of over 100 food boxes to families in Portland. We also provide rent or utilities assistance when our budget allows. At this time both our cupboards and coffers are getting pretty bare. Please consider donating food items for our pantry or cash/check in the attached envelope so that we may continue to support the poor in our neighborhood. The back of this flyer lists suggested donations for every week of the year. Of course, anything on the list at any time is also much appreciated! Thank you for your past and continued support of this important mission at St. Rose. May God bless each of you!
