We are saved by entering into a relationship with Jesus. In today's gospel there are three main characters. Of course, Jesus is always center since he is God and human in his very person. There is a Pharisee named Simon who has "invited Jesus to dine with him." Simon, it turns out, was keeping Jesus at a distance. Jesus points out at the end of the story that Simon gave him no "kiss" of greeting. The custom of the day was to greet a guest with an embrace or maybe a touching of the cheeks as men do in some cultures today. I think for us it would be like not extending one's hand for a handshake. Then there was also the custom of providing water for dusty dry feet. Simon omitted those signs of welcome. He invited Jesus but did not fully welcome him in. He sat in judgement upon him, "If this man were a prophet he would know who and what sort of woman is touching him, that she is a sinner." Maybe you have sensed that you have not been fully welcomed into certain circles, that there is a distance, that you do not fully belong. It is obvious that this is the case with Simon's welcome of Jesus. Now the other main character is a woman who is **behind** Jesus with tears falling on his **feet** and using her hair to wipe them, kissing his feet, and anointing them with some expensive ointment. Now she is honoring him and seeking a relationship with him, knowing that she is not worthy of him, yet none-the-less, drawing close seeking his presence. Her attitude, her awareness of her need of forgiveness, her love expressed was what saved her. Jesus told the unnamed woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace." We say at every Mass, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." Do we really have a sense of how bad we need Jesus, that we would be condemned to the eternal fires of hell without him? Or do I think, in a subtle way, that I am a good person and have never done anything that would need Jesus to die for me? For our faith to save us we have to throw ourselves at the feet of Jesus, recognizing how bad we need him.
