

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" (Mark 12:28) Jesus as he is a good, practicing Jew, gives an answer that comes from the Hebrew scriptures (the Old Testament). He sheds new light on the law when he combines two passages from the Jewish scriptures. The first is Deut 6:4, which we hear in the first reading today, about love of God and the second is Lev

19:18 about love of neighbor. Both Deuteronomy and Leviticus were considered the Law for the Jews. The driving force of Jesus was to keep these two loves together: love of God and neighbor. That is why he told (in Mark 10, only two chapters earlier) the rich young man, who kept all the commandments, that he was lacking one thing. Jesus said "go and sell what you have, and give to the poor." You can not love God and ignore the poor in Jesus' world. I John 3:17 would say it this way, "I ask you, how can God's love survive in a man who has enough of this world's goods yet closes his heart to his brother when he sees him in need?" This letter, from John, keeps driving home the point of how love of God and neighbor must be tied together, "If anyone says, 'My love is fixed on God,' yet hates his brother, he is a liar. One who has no love for the brother he has seen cannot love the God he has not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: whoever loves God must also love his brother" (I John 4:20 & 21).

Part of the love of God is prayer. I am thankful that the Diocese mandates that priests have to go on retreat every year, because then I do not have to go back and forth deciding whether I have the time for retreat. I have always been part of the November diocesan priest retreat. It seems like fall lends itself for reflection. Fr. Bernie, as well, is gone on this retreat. Fr.
