This weekend we celebrate Our
Lord Jesus Christ, King of the
Universe. Even though this is
the year of Mark's gospel we
read from John's gospel. Jesus
says that his kingdom does not
belong to this world. He further
tells Pilate, "For this I was born

and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who
belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (John 18:37). Sometimes, we do not
want to listen to the truth because that means we have to change our lives.
There will be a consequence for not listening. In Matthew's gospel, chapter
25, Jesus describes the judgement scene from that other world when he
says that the Son of Man will come in all his glory and will separate the sheep
from the goats. The sheep are the ones that inherit eternal life and they are
the ones that feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit
prisoners, welcome the stranger and tend to the sick. The ones that are not
involved will suffer greatly in the fires prepared for the devil and his angels.
This coming year, we read from Luke's gospel for this feast. There are two
thieves hanging on either side of Jesus. One blasphemes Jesus, the other
rebukes him and throws himself at Jesus' mercy. 'Jesus remember me when
you come into your kingdom.' (Jesus) replied to him, 'Amen, I say to you
today, you will be with me in Paradise' (Luke 23:42-43). Even if we do our
best to listen to the truth and to act on that truth, in the end we will have to
throw ourselves at the mercy of Jesus for our failures. May we be actively
trying to pray with sincere hearts "thy kingdom come, thy will be done". May
we, also, keep asking the Lord to help us listen to what our call is in the end.
And may we not be so smug to think we have fully listened & obeyed the
voice of Truth, but throw ourselves before the mercy of Jesus...
