EUCCHARISTIC PROCESSION FOR EASTER

This weekend, we delve into the Passion of Christ. He suffered and died for you and me. In Isaiah, we read, *“Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all”* (Is 53:4-6). During this time of pandemic, we need to remember that Christ has taken all of our miseries upon Himself. The great healing He offers isn't simply for our body, which He plans on raising up but, more importantly, the healing of our soul. If our soul is saved, then our body will be too. If our souls are damned, then too will our body be. The entire Body of Christ has been experiencing the Lord's Passion this Lent, and will continue to do so even into the season of Easter. However, the dawn of Resurrection is upon us.

Next weekend is Easter. Even though we cannot have a public Mass to celebrate this momentous event in our salvation, we are going to proclaim Christ is Risen nonetheless. I invite all parishioners to come in their cars to our church parking lot next Sunday at 10:30 am. We will have a vehicle Eucharistic Procession. I will stand in the back of Tony Dumas' truck with our Eucharistic Jesus in the monstrance (the gold sunburst container that we use to expose Him) and Deacon Mike will incense Him. We will then have a procession of vehicles following Jesus throughout the town of Grafton. At the end of the procession, I will bless each car with Jesus in the monstrance. This will replace Tony and my traveling around with the Lord later in the day. However, except for Easter Sunday next week, Tony and I will continue to bring Jesus through the streets every Sunday at 3pm until we have public Mass again.

Our Resurrected Jesus wants to flood our town with His Divine Mercy. He said to St. Faustina, ***“In the Host is the power; it will defend you always”*** (Diary 616). St. Faustina records in her diary a dozen times about seeing the red and white rays of Divine Mercy coming from the Holy Eucharist, covering the entire world. One such time, she noted, *“...when I was in church waiting for confession, I saw the same rays issuing from the monstrance and spreading throughout the church”* (Diary 370).

Jesus said to her about the rays of mercy: ***“The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the water that makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls ...These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when my agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross”*** (Diary, 299).

We begin the Novena to the Divine Mercy this coming Friday, which is Good Friday. There are copies of the Novena and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy (prayed on regular rosary beads) that goes with the Novena in the Family Spiritual Survival Packs located on the wooden table in our Gathering Space. We want Jesus to cover us in His Divine Mercy. I pray this gift of mercy will prompt us to sincere repentance and a true amendment of our lives. Let us bask in the glow of His love and place before Him all our sinfulness. Let us not waste the opportunity given by this pandemic to become holy and righteous in the Lord's sight. Immerse yourself in His Divine Mercy. Onward, brothers and sister, to holiness and God's magnificent glory!

May God be praised and may you be blessed!

The procession route:

Starting at the Church, we go South to 16th St. Then, East on 16th St. to Marvel Ave. and 14th St. We'll go West to Hill Ave. We then go North to 5th St. and then East to Eastern Ave. Then North to 5th St. We then go East to McHugh Ave. Then South to 12th St. Then West to School Rd. Then South to 15th St. Then we head East back to St. John's parking lot. We will conclude with car blessings.
