Souls in Purgatory: November 2 is All Souls day. For the whole month of November we pray for the deceased. Praying for the dead is one of the Church's spiritual works of mercy. There is a Saint known for her concern for the Souls in Purgatory: St. Gertrude the Great. She had a deep empathy for those departed souls, and would ask God at each Mass to have mercy on them. God replied to St. Gertrude that He would use whatever was offered to Him for the faithful departed, according to His inclination to show pardon & mercy. Jesus revealed to her His infinite love, and asked her to spread it, with love, for the suffering and for sinners. This is the prayer given by Jesus to St. Gertrude for the Holy Souls in Purgatory: Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen. Jesus told St. Gertrude that He would release 1000 souls each time this prayer was said.
