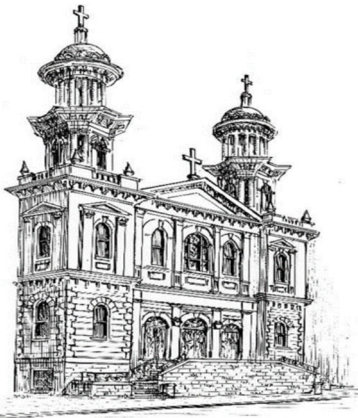

FROM FATHER CHUCK'S DESK

Note: As you know, I got back from vacation last week and since the bulletins did not arrive in time for last weekend, I am reprinting most of my letter from last weekend. My apologies to those who may have already read this on our website or from the bulletins when they arrived later in the week.

Last week I mentioned that I would say more about the St. Vincent de Paul Society and since September 27 was his memorial in the Church, what better time! When I was in seminary, I had the opportunity to serve a parish through their St. Vincent de Paul Society conference. The St. Vincent de Paul Society is a rich ministry of the Church that is based in the spirituality of St. Vincent de Paul. It involves an outreach to the poor through home visits, direct assistance, awareness of resources and referrals. A "conference" is the St. Vincent community that serves, in the name of a parish, centered in prayer and regular support. I think there are only two parishes with active St. Vincent de Paul conferences in our diocese, St. Teresa of Avila in Carson City and St. Therese of the Little Flower in Reno. If you are interested in being a part of starting this ministry at the Cathedral, please leave word for me at the parish office or talk to me after mass. I hope to have more information for you at our parish Ministry Fair as well.

In the month of October, Catholics around the country honor the first Sunday as "Respect Life Sunday" and the month of October as Respect Life Month. Our teaching is strong and consistent in honoring the worth & dignity of every human life, from conception until natural death. A foundational element of our Catholic Social Teaching on respecting life is our opposition to abortion and, more pointedly, our belief that human life begins at conception. As such, that life has equal value with all other human lives and, in many cases, is the most vulnerable. The 40 Days for Life campaign has begun, when prayer vigils all around the land are happening to witness to life and to end abortion. Special thanks to Susan who was with us several weekends after Mass to take sign-ups for the vigil in Reno. (If you are interested in participating and didn't get the chance to sign up, let us know in the Parish Office.) The Catholic stance on life and against abortion is not to condemn women, or men, who can face extremely difficult stresses & choices in their lives. Rather, it's to support people during those times by showing another way and the truth of life itself. It takes a community of love to teach and support change and we must never tire of doing so. It's important that our voices be heard about the lives at stake: in prayer, among our families and friends, with our elected officials and in the ballot box, in those rare times when we have an opportunity to do so on this issue. And we cannot stop at the issue of abortion. One of the most powerful views we have to offer as Catholics - that appears to fly in the face of parties and politics - is that we hold the same value on lives already born as we do on lives not yet born. Our teaching is rich with the call to care for the children who are poor and without the basic necessities of life, such as food, clean water, health care, education, opportunity and respect. Catholic teaching calls us to care for the worker who can't live on the wages getting paid or works in unhealthy conditions. Catholic teaching mandates that we care for the immigrant, the sick and those in prison, always ensuring their human dignity. Catholic teaching opposes euthanasia, assisted suicide and any other form of suicide. Catholic teaching opposes the death penalty as contrary to respecting human life, in the same way that all those areas I have mentioned fail to respect human life. As we respect every human life, we cannot separate how all of creation is connected. The rapid changes in the environment & climate we continue to see in our world is bringing destruction to God's creation and always affect the poor the most. May our prayer, observances and witness this month bear great fruit.

As a final note, please remember to check out our many patrons who advertise in our bulletin. Many of them are parishioners. Their choice to support us in this way provides free bulletins to the parish each week and even a small annual rebate to the parish. **THANK YOU** to all our advertisers!

La semana pasada mencioné que compartiría más sobre la Sociedad San Vicente de Paúl, el 27 de Septiembre fue su memorial en la Iglesia, ¡qué mejor momento! Cuando estaba en seminario tuve la oportunidad de servir a una parroquia a través de su conferencia de la Sociedad San Vicente de Paúl. La Sociedad de San Vicente de Paúl es un ministerio de la Iglesia que se basa en la espiritualidad de San Vicente de Paúl. Este ministerio implica un acercamiento a los pobres a través de visitas domiciliarias, asistencia directa, conciencia de los recursos y referencias. Una "conferencia" es la comunidad que sirve, en nombre de una parroquia, centrada en la oración y el apoyo regular. Creo que sólo hay dos parroquias con conferencias activas de San Vicente de Paúl en la Diócesis de Reno, Santa Teresa de Ávila en Carson City y Santa Teresa del Niño Jesús en Reno. Si usted está interesado en ser parte de iniciar este ministerio en la Catedral, déjeme un mensaje en la Oficina Parroquial o hable conmigo después de la misa. Espero tener más información para usted en nuestra Feria del Ministerio de la parroquia también.

En el mes de Octubre, los católicos de todo el país honramos el 1^{er}. Domingo como "Domingo de Respeto a la Vida" y el mes de Octubre como "Mes del Respeto a la Vida". Nuestra enseñanza es fuerte y consistente en honrar el valor y la dignidad de toda vida humana, desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural. Un elemento fundamental de nuestra Enseñanza Social Católica sobre el respeto de la vida es la oposición al aborto y más concretamente, nuestra creencia de que la vida humana comienza en la concepción. Como tal, que la vida tiene el mismo valor que todas las demás vidas humanas y en muchos casos, es la más vulnerable. La campaña de 40 Días por la Vida ha comenzado, con vigiliyas de oración alrededor del mundo se llevan a cabo para dar testimonio de la vida y poner fin al aborto. Un agradecimiento especial a Susan que estuvo con nosotros varios fines de semana después de misa para apuntar a voluntarios para participar en la vigilia aquí en Reno. (Si está interesado en participar y no tuvo la oportunidad de apuntarse, háganoslo saber en la Oficina Parroquial.) La postura católica sobre la vida y contra el aborto no es condenar a las mujeres ni a los hombres, que pueden enfrentar tensiones y opciones extremadamente difíciles en sus vidas. Más bien, es apoyar a las personas durante esos periodos, compartiendo otras opciones y la verdad de la vida misma. Se necesita una comunidad de amor para enseñar y apoyar el cambio y nunca debemos cansarnos de hacerlo. Es importante que nuestra voz se escuche acerca de la vida en juego: en la oración, entre nuestras familias y amigos, con nuestros funcionarios electos y en las urnas, en esos momentos ocasionales que tenemos la oportunidad de defender esta causa. Y no podemos detenernos en el tema del aborto. Uno de los puntos de vista más poderosos que tenemos que ofrecer como católicos - que parece volar frente a los partidos y la política - es que demos el mismo valor a las vidas ya nacidas que a las vidas que aún no han nacido. Nuestra enseñanza católica es incontable en el llamado a cuidar a los niños pobres que no tienen las necesidades básicas de la vida, como comida, agua potable, atención médica, educación, oportunidades y respeto. La enseñanza católica nos llama a cuidar al trabajador que no puede vivir del salario que recibe o trabaja en condiciones desfavorables. La enseñanza católica exige que cuidemos a los enfermos y a los que están en prisión, garantizando siempre su dignidad humana. La enseñanza católica se opone a la eutanasia, el suicidio asistido y cualquier otro tipo de suicidio. La enseñanza católica se opone a la pena de muerte por ser contraria al respeto de la vida humana, de la misma manera que las situaciones que he mencionado no respetan la vida humana. Al respetar toda vida humana, no podemos separar cómo está conectada toda la creación. Los cambios acelerados en el medio ambiente y el clima que seguimos viendo en nuestro mundo siempre afectan a los pobres. Que nuestra oración, las observancias y el testimonio de este mes den grandes frutos.
