# FROM FATHER CHUCK

We have reached our last Sunday before Lent begins. **Ash Wednesday** is this coming Wednesday, February 26. I remember as a child hearing “older” folks say how swiftly time goes the older one gets and being rather dismissive of the comment. Now that I am among the “older” folks, I certainly understand. It seems like we barely put the Christmas decorations away and here comes Lent! It is not even particularly early this year. Anyway, it is upon us, this holy, prayerful and quiet time of year. I encourage each and all of us to commit to some special observance during the next six weeks that will help us deepen our faith and our relationship with the Lord, both individually and communally.

Some things you might consider are coming to daily Mass, participating in Thursday afternoon Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament or the evening Vespers, Friday evening Stations of the Cross, celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation and actively participating in outreach to the poor. As a parish community we will journey with those in struggling countries through **CRS Rice Bowl**. This excellent Catholic Relief Services effort helps us pray through Lent, reflecting on the social teachings of the Church and the lives of those in need. This year’s theme is “For Lent, for Life” and will include stories of hope from Vietnam, Kenya and Honduras. The CRS Rice Bowl packets are available in the vestibules of the church and I urge each family or parishioner household to take one home and use it as part of your Lenten observance.

As we will hear through the Sacred Scriptures on Ash Wednesday, Lent calls us to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. I have mentioned forms of prayer and almsgiving above. As Church, the fasting we share is in the form of abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday we also fast by eating just one full meal and only a light snack for the other meals of the day. Note that seniors or those with health issues that could be affected by fasting are exempt from this observance. Individuals also may choose to fast or abstain in other ways during Lent. Fasting and abstinence are used to call to mind that we are in a holy season, to connect us to the passion and suffering of Christ and to connect us to the sufferings of so many in our world.

Another Lenten sacrificial giving opportunity will be our Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) which will begin soon. Those who are on the CSA list already received a letter and pledge information from our bishop. We will be following up soon to begin the campaign here at the Cathedral.

I am happy to welcome a new organist to our area and to the Cathedral. **Bryan Ebers** recently moved to our diocese from Baltimore where he was active in music ministry. He is living at Incline Village but wants to continue to use his skills on a pipe organ, which are rare in our area. Bryan will be playing at the Cathedral for Sunday morning Mass a couple of times each month, mostly at the 7:30 AM Mass. Welcome Bryan, glad to have you with us!

As always, I encourage all those who are a part of the parish to consider being involved in some ministry. Lent is a good time to discern how you might serve in your parish. There is always a need for ministers at mass: lectors, greeters, ushers, servers, Eucharistic Ministers and music ministers. I am especially struggling with getting a vibrant hospitality ministry in place. We are discerning the establishment of a St. Vincent de Paul Conference at the Cathedral as well. Include in your Lenten reflection how the Lord might be inviting you to serve.

## DEL PADRE CHUCK

Hemos llegado al último Domingo antes de que comience la Cuaresma. **El 26 de este mes es Miércoles de Ceniza.** Recuerdo que cuando era niño escuchaba a las personas "mayores" decir que, entre más viejo se hace uno, el tiempo pasa más rápido. Igualmente recuerdo no haberle dado mucha importancia al comentario. Ahora que estoy entre los "mayores", ciertamente lo entiendo. Parece que apenas guardamos las decoraciones navideñas y ya viene la Cuaresma. Ni siquiera es particularmente temprano este año. De cualquier manera, ya está aquí la época santa de oración y paz. Animo a todos y cada uno de nosotros a comprometernos con alguna observancia especial durante las próximas seis semanas que nos ayudará a profundizar nuestra fe y nuestra relación con el Señor, tanto individual como comunitariamente.

Algunas observaciones a considerar podrían ser el asistir a Misa durante la semana, participar en la Adoración del Santísimo Sacramento los Jueves por la tarde, participar en las Estaciones de la Cruz los Viernes por la noche, celebrando el Sacramento de la Reconciliación y activamente ayudando a los pobres. Como comunidad parroquial caminaremos con países con dificultades económicas a través del Tazón de Arroz (**CRS Rice Bowl**). Este trabajo de los Servicios de Asistencia Católicos nos ayuda a orar a través de la Cuaresma, reflexionando sobre las enseñanzas sociales de la Iglesia y la vida de los más necesitados. El tema de este año es "Por la Cuaresma, por la Vida" e incluirá historias de esperanza de Vietnam, Kenia y Honduras. Las cajitas del Tazón de Arroz están disponibles en los vestíbulos de la iglesia e invito a cada familia a llevar uno a casa y usarlo como parte de su observancia cuaresmal.

Como escucharemos a través de las Sagradas Escrituras del Miércoles de Ceniza, la Cuaresma nos llama a la oración, el ayuno y limosna. He mencionado las formas de oración y limosna anteriores. Como Iglesia, el ayuno que compartimos es en forma de abstinencia de la carne el Miércoles de Ceniza y los Viernes durante la Cuaresma. El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo también ayunamos comiendo solo una comida completa y un aperitivo ligero para las otras comidas del día. Tenga en cuenta que las personas de la tercera edad o aquellos con problemas de salud están exentas de esta observancia. Las personas también pueden optar por ayunar o abstenerse de otras maneras durante la Cuaresma. El ayuno y la abstinencia son para recordarnos que estamos en un tiempo santo, para conectarnos con la pasión y el sufrimiento de Cristo y para conectarnos con los sufrimientos de tantos en nuestro mundo.

Otra oportunidad de sacrificio Cuaresmal pudiera ser la Campaña de Fondos para los Servicios Católicos (CSA) que comenzará pronto. Aquellos que están en la lista de CSA ya recibieron una carta e información sobre la Campaña de parte del Señor Obispo. Pronto comenzaremos la campaña en la Catedral.

Me complace dar la bienvenida a nuestro nuevo organista **Bryan Ebers**. Él se mudó recientemente a desde Baltimore, donde estuvo activo en el ministerio de música. Está viviendo en Incline Village, pero quiere seguir usando sus habilidades en nuestra área. Bryan tocará aquí en la Catedral en la Misa del Domingo por la mañana un par de veces al mes, principalmente en la Misa de las 7:30 AM. ¡Bienvenido Bryan, me alegro de tenerte con nosotros!

Como siempre, animo a todos los que forman parte de la parroquia a considerar el ser parte de algún ministerio. La Cuaresma es un buen momento para discernir cómo usted podría servir en su parroquia. Siempre hay necesidad de ministros en las Misa: lectores, ujieres, servidores, ministros para dar la bienvenida, ministros de la Eucarística y ministros de música. Estoy trabajando de manera especial para formar un ministerio vibrante de hospitalidad. También estamos discerniendo el establecimiento de una Conferencia de San Vicente de Paúl en la Catedral. # JOURNEY TO THE FOOT OF THE CROSS

## 10 THINGS TO REMEMBER FOR LENT

**By Bishop David L. Ricken of Green Bay, Wisconsin, former chairman of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis.**

1. **Remember the formula.** The Church does a good job capturing certain truths with easy-to-remember lists and formulas: 10 Commandments, 7 sacraments, 3 persons in the Trinity. For Lent, the Church gives us almost a slogan—Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving—as the three things we need to work on during the season.
2. **It's a time of prayer.** Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we go on a journey, one that hopefully brings us closer to Christ & leaves us changed by the encounter with him.
3. **It's a time to fast.** With the fasts of Ash Wednesday & Good Friday, meatless Fridays, and our personal disciplines interspersed, Lent is the only time many Catholics these days actually fast. And maybe that's why it gets all the attention. "What are you giving up for Lent? Hotdogs? Beer? Jelly beans?" It's almost a game for some of us, but fasting is actually a form of penance, which helps us turn away from sin and toward Christ.
4. **It's a time to work on discipline.** The 40 days of Lent are also a good, set time to work on personal discipline in general. Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive. "I'm going to exercise more. I'm going to pray more. I'm going to be nicer to my family, friends and coworkers."
5. **It's about dying to yourself.** The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it's about more than self-control – it's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die. The suffering and death of Christ are foremost on our minds during Lent, and we join in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ and being resurrected in a purified form.
6. **Don't do too much.** It's tempting to make Lent some ambitious period of personal reinvention, but it's best to keep it simple and focused. There's a reason the Church works on these mysteries year after year. We spend our entire lives growing closer to God. Don't try to cram it all in one Lent. That's a recipe for failure.
7. **Lent reminds us of our weakness.** Of course, even when we set simple goals for ourselves during Lent, we still have trouble keeping them. When we fast, we realize we're all just one meal away from hunger. In both cases, Lent shows us our weakness. This can be painful, but recognizing how helpless we are makes us seek God's help with renewed urgency and sincerity.
8. **Be patient with yourself.** When we're confronted with our own weakness during Lent, the temptation is to get angry and frustrated. "What a bad person I am!" But that's the wrong lesson. God is calling us to be patient and to see ourselves as he does, with unconditional love.
9. **Reach out in charity.** As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering or otherwise in need. The third part of the Lenten formula is almsgiving. It's about more than throwing a few extra dollars in the collection plate; it's about reaching out to others and helping them without question as a way of sharing the experience of God's unconditional love.
10. **Learn to love like Christ.** Giving of ourselves in the midst of our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on cross for all of us. Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, as we seek him out, ask his help, join in his suffering, and learn to love like him.
