For weekday mass, this will start on Tuesday, April 7, so please make a note to yourself and share the word. It also will be used this Sunday for the bishop's mass at the Cathedral as noted below.

This Sunday is **Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion**. Bishop Calvo will celebrate our mass, live-streamed at **12:15pm on youtube at the Diocese of Reno channel** or just cut and paste this in your search engine: <https://youtu.be/uCFZsCL8g0w>. It is very important, if at all possible, that you share in the mass at the time the bishop is celebrating. We all can pray together that way. Fr. Lucio and I also will concelebrate mass in Spanish at 2:00pm using our St. Thomas Aquinas Cathedral channel so that we can inform everyone of the change.
