Guest Speaker: Monica Amparo. Monica was born into a Catholic family in Texas. In 1973, she lost her only brother at the age of eight, an experience which taught her early on that people are more important than things. In 1979 her youngest sibling was born who would later be diagnosed as autistic with epilepsy. Despite these family challenges her parents remained committed to their faith as they raised their six daughters. This early model of “walking the talk” left a deep impression on her. After graduating from law school Monica earned a Masters in Law degree from Georgetown University. She subsequently married and has one daughter. The family is active in two Catholic groups – the Focolare Movement (whose charism is unity) and Families in Christ Jesus, a charismatic community. Monica is in the Divine Mercy Cenacle which studies the writings of St. Faustina. Monica has further spiritual training from the “school of life” and learned that regardless of what happens, it really is best to trust in the Lord and to seek His will. Monica was initiated into the renewal movement 10 years ago at a “Life in the Spirit” seminar where she learned about a personal relationship with the Lord, and spiritual warfare. After all these years, she understands the power of the Holy Spirit in her life. Come, bring your friends and enjoy a great morning of fellowship and a good breakfast.

Human beings must always seek to perfect their behavior toward each other and this continuing process of improving man’s condition is positive and necessary, and I believe blessed and ordained by God.
