PASTOR'S CORNER: The section of Luke's gospel that we have been hearing from at mass the past few weeks have been dealing with the response of the disciples to follow Jesus. Our response is to be an active giving of ourselves to follow in his footsteps. It requires more than just attending mass on the weekend. The following story I have used in the past but I never tire of it as it speaks so well of our responsibility to respond to the call of Christ in our lives.

OUR LADY QUEEN OF PEACE “Tell me the weight of a snowflake,” a coal-mouse asked a wild dove. “Nothing more than nothing,” was the answer.

“In that case I must tell you a story,” the coal-mouse said. “I sat on the branch of a fir, close to its trunk when it began to snow heavily, without a sound and without any violence. I counted the snowflakes settling on the twigs and needles of my branch. Their number was exactly 3,731,952. When the 3,731,953rd dropped onto the branch, nothing more than nothing as you say, the branch broke.”

The dove thought about the story for a while and finally said to himself, “Perhaps there is only one person’s voice lacking for peace to come to the world.” Make sure it’s not your voice that is lacking.

“THE JOY OF LOVE” is Pope Francis’ apostolic exhortation which draws on the conclusion of the Synod of Bishops, which gathered over the course of two years to discuss challenges to the family. You can download the entire statement from the Vatican website, www.vatican.va. Copies are also available at local bookstores. I would encourage you to read for yourself this statement but some of the highlights will be printed each week in the bulletin over the summer.

Ch 7 Toward a Better Education of Children:

- What is most important is the ability lovingly to help children grow in freedom, maturity, overall discipline, and real autonomy. Only in this way will children come to possess the wherewithal needed to fend for themselves and to act intelligently and prudently whenever they meet with difficulties. (#261)
- Children who are lovingly corrected feel cared for; they perceive that they are individuals whose potential is recognized. (#269)

- The family is the first school of human values, where we learn the wise use of freedom. (#274)
- Every day the family has to come up with new ways of appreciating and acknowledging its members. (#276)
- Since adolescents usually have issues with authority and rules, it is best to encourage their own experience of faith and to provide them with alternative testimonies that win them over by their sheer beauty. (#288)


