## MESSAGE FROM THE DEACON

Today's gospel message is delivered in a healing story. A group of people bring one of their companions before Jesus so that he might return his hearing and ability to speak. Of course, Jesus being Jesus, he does exactly that, and we can move on. God is Good!

But there is always more to the story. Mark is very efficient with his use of words. A seemingly simple story is full of hope and good teaching for us Christians today. First, the story is a great example of the power of many asking for the same thing. When we pray and ask God for assistance as a group whether as a church or people praying for each other, it is fruitful.

Secondly, each one of us matters individually to God. Jesus could have just as easily done the healing as soon as the man was brought before him. Instead, Jesus took the deaf person aside. He made a personal connection with the deaf person. Mark points out this detail as a way of communicating that God works on a personal level too. Each one of us is important to Him and our healings are a result of this individual personal love that God has for each one of us.

Thirdly, Jesus visibly shows that he is the connection between the divine gifts of the Father and earth. "He looks up to heaven and groans." Yes, he is the intermediary between the earthly creation and God the Father. "For in him all things were created; all things have been created through him and for him." But we were made for Christ. We are a gift to him, and he cherishes each one of us as such.
