LAPEER, June 4.—George O. Squier, of Dryden, Lapeer Co., who was recently selected by the commission at Port Huron as the successful candidate for the West Point cadetship from this district, left for the West Point Military School yesterday. He is a very thorough and energetic student, and will undoubtedly make a bright mark for himself at the military school. Young Squier was born in Dryden, March 21, 1863. His mother died when he was a small boy. During the last ten years he has been living with his grandfather, Ethan Squier. He has always attended school at Dryden, excepting from 1879 to 1881, when he was engaged as clerk in the store of Lamb & Co., of Imlay City. He also attended school at Lapeer a short time last fall. He graduated at Dryden in June, 1882, under the present Principal, C. E. Palmerlee, but had been going to school to Prof. Frank Millis most of that year. It was, however, under the guidance of Cyrus E. Messer, from 1876 to 1879, that he first brought to view his talents as a scholar. He has the best wishes of all who know him.
