

Almont Hails First Citizen

Highway Named for Gen. Squier

ALMONT, Mich., Aug. 11—His country neighbors and townsmen today gathered to honor Gen. George O. Squier as a five-mile road running west from here was named for him. Squier Road forms a connecting link of good roads from all surrounding towns to Forest Hall, near Dryden, a community house planned after the country club idea, where picnics and other gatherings are held. The hall and adjacent grounds were donated by Gen. Squier 15 years ago.

At the dedication, the Rev. H. H. Cheeney, of the Almont Baptist Church, gave the invocation, and the Rev. E. L. Crystal, of Grace Tabernacle, the address. The Rev. Mr. Crystal declared the dedication a "feeble token" of the esteem of residents of the vicinity for Gen. Squier.

In replying, the general, who has been decorated by five nations and honored as the inventor of wired wireless and the monophone, declared he was more pleased by the expression of his country neighbors than by any honor that had been bestowed on him.

Gen. Squier was born on a farm which now constitutes half of the village of Dryden.
