Divine Worship

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH) Chapter 1E states:

Section 1.25.6: "If a person is unable to tolerate both a low-gluten host or the Precious Blood under the species of wine - even mustum - there is little else the Church can do except to recommend that he or she make a spiritual Communion. Perpetual abstinence from the Eucharist, which such a condition requires, is the highest form of suffering a Catholic may be asked to endure. A person with this affliction should be brought to understand that he or she shares in the suffering of Christ in a most unique way.

Section 1.25.7: "Participation in the celebration of the Eucharistic sacrifice is a source and means of grace even apart from the actual reception of Holy Communion. It has also been long understood that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion during Mass, it is possible to make a spiritual communion that is also a source of grace. Spiritual communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping him present in his Body and Blood."¹¹⁰

Abusive Distribution of Foodstuffs

Section 1.26.1: No bread made from rice or any other non-wheat product can ever be substituted for the wheat bread and grape wine required for the validity of the Eucharist, nor should such invalid matter ever be blessed or used in any way to simulate the administration of Holy Communion.

Section 1.26.2: Therefore the practice is reprobated whereby either unconsecrated hosts or other edible or inedible things are distributed during the celebration of Holy Mass or beforehand after the manner of Communion, contrary to the prescriptions of the liturgical books. For such a practice in no way accords with the tradition of the Roman Rite, and carries with it the danger of causing confusion among Christ's faithful concerning the Eucharistic doctrine of the Church.¹¹¹

Section 1.26.3: Where there exists in certain places by concession a particular custom of blessing bread after Mass for distribution, proper catechesis should very carefully be given concerning this action. In fact, no other similar practices should be introduced, nor should unconsecrated hosts ever be used for this purpose."¹¹²
