Divine Worship

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH) Chapter 1F states:

Section 1.27.5: Reprobated is any practice of using for the celebration of Mass common vessels, or others lacking in quality, or devoid of all artistic merit or which are mere containers, as also other vessels made from glass, earthenware, clay, or other materials that break easily.¹¹⁵ At the same time any use in place of the sacred vessels of containers such as simple baskets or other receptacles meant for ordinary use outside the sacred celebration is strictly forbidden.

Section 1.27.6: Before they are used, sacred vessels are to be blessed by a priest according to the rites laid down in the liturgical books. It is praiseworthy for the blessing to be given by the Archbishop, who will judge whether the vessels are worthy of the use to which they are destined.¹¹⁶

Section 1.27.7: It is a praiseworthy practice to cover the chalice with a veil, which may be either the color of the day or white.¹¹⁷

Section 1.27.8: When several chalices are to be used, it is praiseworthy, by reason of the sign value, to use a main chalice of larger dimensions, together with smaller chalices.¹¹⁸

Section 1.27.9: To avoid any danger of spilling the Precious Blood, during the consecration flagons, bowls, or other vessels not fully in accord with the established norms are never to be used.¹¹⁹ The wine to be consecrated may, however, be brought forward in a dignified flagon, decanter or similar vessel and then poured into the chalice(s) at the preparation of gifts.

Section 1.27.10: The pouring of the Blood of Christ after the consecration from one vessel to another is completely to be avoided, lest anything should happen that would be to the detriment of so great a mystery.¹²⁰
