## Divine Worship

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH) Chapter 1G states:

### *Liturgical Colors*

Section 1.32.1: The sacred vestments worn by bishops, priests and deacons follow the traditional system of liturgical colors. The vesture of lay ministers and others called to functions in the liturgical celebration do not.

Section 1.32.2: The purpose of a variety of color of the sacred vestments is to give effective expression even outwardly to the specific character of the mysteries of faith being celebrated and to give a sense of the Christian life's passage through the course of the liturgical year. As to the colors of sacred vestments, the traditional and present usage is as follows.<sup>131</sup>

- a. White is used in the Offices and Masses during the Easter time and Christmas time; also for celebrations of the Blessed Trinity, for celebrations of the Lord other than of his Passion, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, of the Holy Angels, and of the Saints who were not Martyrs; on the Solemnities of All Saints (1 November), the Nativity of St. John the Baptist (24 June), the Feasts of St. John the Evangelist (27 December), of the Chair of Saint Peter (22 February), and of the Conversion of St. Paul (25 January).
- b. Red is used on Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, on Good Friday, on Pentecost Sunday, on celebrations of the Lord's Passion, for Masses of the Holy Spirit, on the feasts of the Apostles and Evangelists, and on celebrations of Martyr Saints.
- c. Green is used in the Offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.
- d. Violet or purple is used in Advent and Lent. It may also be worn in Offices and Masses for the Dead.
- e. Violet, white, or black vestments may be worn at funeral services and at other Offices and Masses for the Dead.<sup>132</sup>
- f. Rose may be used, as is the practice in the Archdiocese, on the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) and the Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday).
- g. Sacred vestments may be used on more solemn days that are festive, that is, more precious, even if they are not of the color of the day.<sup>133</sup> Clearly pastoral good sense will be used to avoid arousing catechetical confusion among the people.
- h. Gold or silver colored vestments may be worn on more solemn occasions,<sup>134</sup> preferably in substitution for white and never for celebrations of the Lord's Passion, or for the Dead.
