## Divine Worship

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH) Chapter 11 states:

### *Chants for Processions and after the Readings*

Section 1.50.1: For the Entrance Chant, in the Dioceses of the United States of America, there are four options: (1) the antiphon from the Roman Missal or the antiphon with its Psalm from the *Graduale Romanum*, as set to music there or in another musical setting; (2) the antiphon and Psalm of the *Graduale Simplex* for the liturgical time; (3) a chant from another collection of Psalms and antiphons, approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop, including psalms arranged in responsorial or metrical forms; (4) some other suitable liturgical chant approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop.<sup>184</sup>

Section 1.50.2: After the first Scripture reading at Mass, in the Dioceses of the United States of America, instead of the Psalm assigned in the Lectionary for Mass, there may be sung either (1) the Responsorial Gradual from the *Graduale Romanum*, (2) the Responsorial Psalm or the *Alleluia* Psalm from the *Graduale Simplex*, as described in these books, (3) an antiphon and Psalm from another collection of Psalms and antiphons, including Psalms arranged in metrical form, providing that they have been approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Archbishop. This is sung either by the choir alone, or by the choir or a cantor with the people. It is not permitted to substitute for these options another hymn or chant.<sup>185</sup>

Section 1.50.3 For singing at Communion, in the Dioceses of the United States of America, there are four options: (1) the antiphon from the Roman Missal or the antiphon with its Psalm from the *Graduale Romanum*, as set to music there or in another musical setting; (2) the antiphon with Psalm from the *Graduale Simplex* of the liturgical time; (3) a chant from another collection of Psalms and antiphons, approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop, including psalms arranged in responsorial or metrical forms; (4) some other suitable liturgical chant approved by the Conference of Bishops or the Diocesan Bishop. This is sung either by the choir alone or by the choir or a cantor with the people. While the priest is receiving the Sacrament, the Communion chant is begun.<sup>186</sup>
