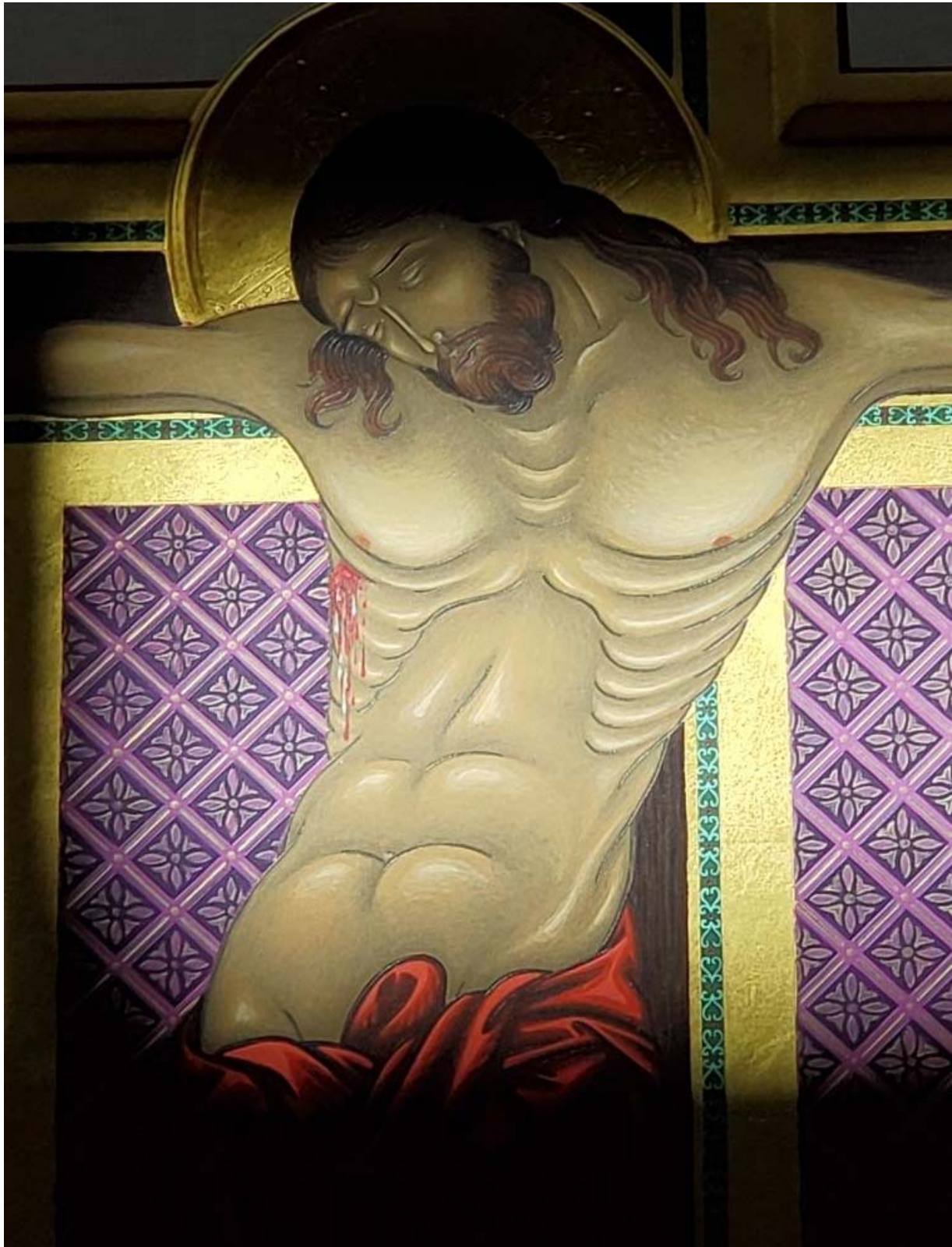

## Divine Worship

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH) Chapter 1J states:

### Homily

Section 1.52.1: There is to be a homily on Sundays and holy days of obligation at all Masses that are celebrated with the participation of a congregation; it may not be omitted without a serious reason. It is recommended on other days, especially on the weekdays of Advent, Lent, and Easter time, as well as on other festive days and occasions when the people come to church in greater numbers. <sup>191</sup>

Section 1.52.2: The homily should be an exposition of some aspect of the readings from Sacred Scripture or of another text from the ordinary or from the Proper of the Mass of the day and should take into account both the mystery being celebrated and the particular needs of the listeners. <sup>192</sup>

Section 1.52.3 The homily should ordinarily be given by the priest celebrant himself. He may entrust it to a concelebrating priest or occasionally to the deacon. <sup>193</sup>

Section 1.52.4 The homily at Mass is reserved to a priest or deacon, since it is the presentation of the mysteries of faith and the norms of Christian living in accordance with Catholic teaching and tradition. <sup>193</sup>

Section 1.52.5 In particular cases and for a just cause, the homily may even be given by a bishop or a priest who is present at the celebration but cannot concelebrate. <sup>194</sup>

Section 1.52.6 The homily at Mass may never be given by a lay person. This prohibition applies also to seminarians, students of theological disciplines, and those who have assumed the function of those known as “pastoral assistants”; nor is there to be any exception for any other kind of layperson, group, community, or association. <sup>195</sup>

Section 1.52.7 If the need arises for the gathered faithful to be given instruction or testimony by a layperson in church concerning the Christian life, it is altogether preferable that this be done outside Mass. Nevertheless, for serious reasons it is permissible that this type of instruction or testimony be given after the priest has proclaimed the Prayer after Communion. This should not become a regular practice, however. Furthermore, these instructions and testimony should not be of such a nature that they could be confused with the homily, nor is it permissible to dispense with the homily on their account. <sup>197</sup>

Section 1.52.7 After the homily, a brief period of silence is appropriately observed. <sup>198</sup>
