Divine Worship

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH) Chapter 1J states:

Section 1.52.8: After the homily, a brief period of silence is appropriately observed.¹⁹⁸

Profession of Faith

Section 1.53.1: In Holy Mass as well as in other celebrations of the Sacred Liturgy, no Creed or Profession of Faith is to be introduced which is not found in the duly approved liturgical books.¹⁹⁹

Prayer of the Faithful

Section 1.54.1: For the Prayer of the Faithful, the intentions are announced from the ambo or from another suitable place, by the deacon, cantor, lector, or one of the lay faithful.²⁰⁰

Section 1.54.2 It is for the priest celebrant to direct this prayer from the chair. He himself begins it with a brief introduction, by which he invites the faithful to pray, and likewise he concludes it with a prayer.²⁰¹

Section 1.54.3 The intentions announced should be few in number and not needlessly multiplied. They should be sober, composed freely but prudently, succinct, and they should express the prayer of the entire community.²⁰²

Section 1.54.4 In the Prayer of the Faithful, as a rule, the series of intentions is to be:

- a. For the needs of the Church.
- b. For public authorities and the salvation of the whole world.
- c. For those burdened by any kind of difficulty.
- d. For the local community.
- e. For the dead.

Section 1.54.5 Nevertheless, in a particular celebration, such as confirmation, marriage, or a funeral, the series of intentions may reflect more closely the particular occasion.²⁰³

Section 1.54.6 Public prayer for other Christians, living or dead, for the needs and intentions of other Churches, ecclesial communities, and their spiritual heads may be offered during the Prayer of the Faithful.²⁰⁴
