Divine Worship

Continuing from Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook (ALH) Chapter 1J states:

Communion Rite

Section 1.60.1: The priest must communicate himself at the altar at the moment laid down by the Roman Missal, and a concelebrating priest must communicate before he proceeds with the distribution of Holy Communion. The priest celebrant or a concelebrant is never to wait until the people's Communion is concluded before receiving Communion himself.²³⁷

Section 1.60.2: If extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are to be used, they should not approach the altar before the priest has received Communion, and they are always to receive from the hands of the priest celebrant the vessel(s) containing either species of the Holy Eucharist for distribution to the faithful.²³⁸

Section 1.60.3: Neither deacons nor lay ministers may ever receive Holy Communion in the manner of a concelebrating priest. The practice of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion waiting to receive Communion until after the distribution of Communion is not in accordance with liturgical law.²³⁹

Section 1.60.4: The priest takes the paten or ciborium and goes to the communicants, who, as a rule, approach in a procession.²⁴⁰

Section 1.60.5: In the course of carrying out their function, which is solely to distribute Holy Communion in the absence of ordinary ministers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are not to administer blessings, especially with the Blessed Sacrament.

Purification of Sacred Vessels

Section 1.61.1: All will remember that once the distribution of Holy Communion during the celebration of Mass has been completed, the prescriptions of the Roman Missal are to be observed, and in particular, whatever may remain of the Blood of Christ must be entirely and immediately consumed by the priest or by another minister, according to the norms, while the consecrated hosts that are left are to be consumed by the priest at the altar or carried to the place for the reservation of the Eucharist.²⁴¹
