The Baptism of Our Lord

This feast that concludes the Christmas--Epiphany cycle presents the beginning of the ministry of Jesus in the midst of a people who longed for the Messiah. In the Gospel, the Father points to Jesus as his beloved son and, with the Holy Spirit, asks that all listen to him. Jesus begins to announce the kingdom through his own life of service. It is the kingdom John the Baptist had been proclaiming, though he assured his disciples that he was not the one they were waiting for. This baptism of conversion, which Jesus did not have to receive, anticipates in a way our own commitment to the proclamation of the kingdom resulting from the baptism we received through the Church.
