Jesus said in reply, "Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?" Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Vaccines will also be available for kindergarten, seventh grade, and college entry. All infant immunizations will also be offered. The Texas Department of State Health Services provides vaccines for those on Medicaid, no insurance, American Indian, Native Alaskan, and the under-insured. **CHIPS, Medicare, and private insurance are not accepted at this clinic and will be referred to another provider.** A parent or guardian must accompany a minor. 
