THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: LUKE 18:9-14

Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. "Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity -- greedy, dishonest, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.' But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.' I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

ADULTS: When have you felt self-satisfied in observing the mistakes of others? What should we remember at such times?

CHILDREN: Have you ever thought you were better than someone else? What is the problem with such thoughts?

All Saints Day – Holy Day of Obligation – November 1st:

During the year the Church celebrates one by one the feasts of the saints. Today she joins them all in one festival. In addition to those whose names she knows, she recalls in a magnificent vision all the others "of all nations and tribes standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands, proclaiming Him who redeemed them in His Blood." The feast of All Saints should inspire us with tremendous hope. Among the saints in heaven are some whom we have known. All lived on earth lives like our own. They were baptized, marked with the sign of faith, they were faithful to Christ's teaching and they have gone before us to the heavenly home whence they call on us to follow them. The Gospel of the Beatitudes, read today, while it shows their happiness, shows, too, the road that they followed; there is no other that will lead us whither they have gone.

All Souls' Day – November 2nd:

PRAYER FOR THE DEPARTED -Eternal rest, grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

FOR ALL THE DECEASED - By Thy resurrection from the dead, O Christ, death no longer hath dominion over those who die in holiness. So, we beseech Thee, give rest to Thy servants in Thy sanctuary and in Abraham's bosom. Grant it to those, who from Adam until now have adored Thee with purity, to our fathers and brothers, to our kinsmen and friends, to all men who have lived by faith and passed on their road to Thee, by a thousand ways, and in all conditions, and make them worthy of the heavenly kingdom.

FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY - O Lord, who art ever merciful and bounteous with Thy gifts, look down upon the suffering souls in purgatory. Remember not their offenses and negligences, but be mindful of Thy loving mercy, which is from all eternity. Cleanse them of their sins and fulfill their ardent desires that they may be made worthy to behold Thee face to face in Thy glory. May they soon be united with Thee and hear those blessed words which will call them to their heavenly home: "Come, blessed of My Father, take possession of the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."



In the first reading, we find that keeping the law, giving alms, and avoiding injustice are true worship and meaningful sacrifice to God. One should be generous, cheerful, and just when making an offering to the Lord. St. Paul tells us, in the second reading, how he fought against all the odds and yet was firm in his faith in Jesus Christ. He was left alone in difficulties, yet Christ stood by him, and he could preach the good news. In the parable, a Pharisee, boasting of his good deeds or self-righteous attitude, justified himself, not needing God's justification. Whereas the tax collector recognized the need for God's mercy and repented for his sins and went home justified.

Jesus looks into the heart of a person. Our almsgiving and practice of rituals alone will not make us righteous, **but what is important is the motive behind them.** God knows the strengths and weakness of men and women. Therefore, we must not judge others. If we are judging those around us as arrogant, selfish, sinners, we fail to remain in a positive state of being. Therefore, engage in finding goodness in others, which alone brings lasting happiness and leads us all on the path of righteousness. What is our attitude towards others? Do we have an attitude of self-righteousness, always judging others by their externals, or do we live by the spirit of love?

Lord Jesus! Help us to become righteous in our action, words, and thoughts. **Rev. Fr. Bose Jujvarapu**

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT:

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time - There is an interesting twist we find in today's gospel when we hear Jesus' parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector praying in the temple. The Pharisee is "praying to himself." It doesn't mean he was praying silently. It seems to mean something a lot more troubling, that he is praying to himself; that God is not his prayer's intended audience. The words of the Pharisee are very much centered on himself: he makes claims about his character. He highlights his own admirable activities. Good stewards of their prayer lives know that a prayer of praise and thanksgiving should focus on the goodness of God. Do your prayers of thanksgiving always stay focused on God's unfathomable, immeasurable goodness and generosity?

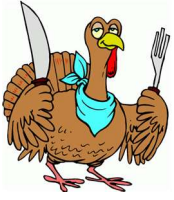
