THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: LUKE 20:27-38

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother. Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

ADULTS: How does your belief in the resurrection of the dead affect the way you live?

CHILDREN: Has someone in your family or among your friends died? Do you think about that person in heaven? What do you hope to talk about with this person?

We ask that you, Lord, would show them miracles as they seek to gain health, stability, and wholeness. We pray these things in Jesus' name. Amen

MONTH OF NOVEMBER

Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. As a reminder of our duty to pray for the suffering faithful in Purgatory, the Church has dedicated the month of November to the Holy Souls. The Holy Souls are those who have died in the state of grace but who are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must suffer in Purgatory. The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Winkie Pratney is an author, speaker; evangelist says that God does not guide those who want to run/ruin their own lives. He only guides those who admit their need for His direction and rely on His wisdom. The first reading emphasizes on having trust in God is essential than obeying the earthly powers. The second reading urges us to rely on God's grace which strengthens and guards us against every evil. The Gospel shows us the two aspects of life; the earthly life and the eternal life.

The central theme of the readings is to have deep trust in God. Most of the time, we are faced with the reality of death. Perhaps we may ask, what is there after death? We are always in a dilemma and unable to find a conclusive answer. Is there an end of everything or there is life after death? It can make us restless like the Sadducees in Jewish tradition. We need not worry about it, but hope for newness and new life like the seven brothers who hoped for a new life before persecution. Let us remember that we are the followers of Christ who has assured us a new life after death. Today Jesus is reminding us again that we will receive eternal life provided we live a worthy life. Let us remember the martyrs, saints, and all the faithful departed who believed in God and are with God, interceding for us. Therefore, let us live like the children of God.

Pray and Practice: Lord, we thank you for the gift of life and implore you to increase our trust in you. Amen! God's blessings to you'll and be sure of your Pastor **Rev. Bose Jujavarapu** continued prayers and wish you a blessed week.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT:

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time - In today's second reading we hear Saint Paul urging the members of the community at Thessalonica to direct their hearts to God's love through Christ. He wants them to be laser-focused on Christ, and nothing else. He desires that they be strengthened by the Lord and shielded from what is not Christ-like. Good stewards cultivate a "laser-sharp" focus on Christ; not on things that could give them false or superficial images or ideals. Let's think about our own daily focus: Do we direct our hearts toward Christ or are there other "gods" that claim our attention? Our career? Material possessions? Sexuality? Favorite sports team? Political leanings? Does our daily life point to Christ so that those who are younger and less mature in their faith learn from our example?

-The Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is, "Serving Those Who Serve," providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. This includes members of our own diocese. While the salaries and retirement of military chaplains are paid for by the government, the AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of programs and services vital to the mission and ministry of its mission, including Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal and Veterans Affairs. Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes or parish registries. The AMS has no weekly collections and relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its programs and services. Your support of the 2019 Triennial National Collection for the AMS will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our Country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from your own parish family.
