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THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST: JOHN 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

CHILDREN: In what ways can Jesus' presence in the Eucharist help you do good things for others?

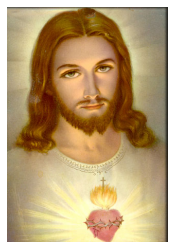


Corpus Christi (Body and Blood of Christ) is a Eucharistic solemnity, or better, the solemn commemoration of the institution of that sacrament. It is, moreover, the Church's official act of homage and gratitude to Christ, who by instituting the Holy Eucharist gave to the Church her greatest treasure. Holy Thursday, assuredly, marks the anniversary of the institution, but the commemoration of the Lord's passion that very night suppresses the rejoicing proper to the occasion. Today's observance, therefore, accents the joyous aspect of Holy Thursday.

Fr. Bose's Birthday is this Monday, June 15th. If you get a chance, wish him a Happy Birthday!



Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus – Friday, June 19 (Mass at 7 PM)



Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus goes back at least to the 11th century, but through the 16th century, it remained a private devotion, often tied to devotion to the Five Wounds of Christ. The first feast of the Sacred Heart was celebrated on August 31, 1670, in Rennes, France, through the efforts of Fr. Jean Eudes (1602-1680). From Rennes, the devotion spread, but it took the visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) for the devotion to become universal.

In all of these visions, in which Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Mary, the Sacred Heart of Jesus played a central role. The "great apparition," which took place on June 16, 1675, during the octave of the Feast of Corpus Christi, is the source of the modern Feast of the Sacred Heart. In that vision, Christ asked St. Margaret Mary to request that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be celebrated on the Friday after the octave (or eighth day) of the Feast of Corpus Christi, in reparation for the ingratitude of men for the sacrifice that Christ had made for them. The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents not simply His physical heart but His love for all mankind.

The devotion became quite popular after St. Margaret Mary's death in 1690, but, because the Church initially had doubts about the validity of St. Margaret Mary's visions, it wasn't until 1765 that the feast was celebrated officially in France. Almost 100 years later, in 1856, Pope Pius IX, at the request of the French bishops, extended the feast to the universal Church. It is celebrated on the day requested by our Lord—the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi, or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday.


The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) UNITED IN BREAD Human hunger for food is perennial and all encompassing. It is even integral to our collective identity. But access to food has been a matter of division in terms of those who have and those who have-not. Some die of starvation while others dump the grains in the oceans. While hunger remains a unifying factor eating degenerated into becoming a divisive factor.

While the disparities will always exist, Jesus tells of a way eating can become liberating. Beyond the divisions and pangs of hunger, there is the solace of an elixir. Bread becoming body is biological, but *body becoming bread and then liberating is the mystery of our union with Christ*. His body becomes the food for all that unites us beyond our parochial divisions. As St. Paul says, 'because there is one bread we who are many are one body' (1Cor 10: 17a). It is the body of Christ that forges our union. Thus every time we eat a piece of bread in Him, we become part of Him. Christ becomes the invisible guest at every meal. By becoming the bread of imperishable life, Jesus gave hope of ultimate satisfaction to the hungry and discredited the futile hunger of greed of the rich. Thus, in Jesus, we have the fulfillment of all our hunger. **Fr. Bose Jujuvarapu**

Pray and Practice: Lord, may we see you hungry and feed you and become one with your body.

LITURGICAL NORMS IN ORDINARY TIME

The Sundays in Ordinary Time are most frequently characterized by the use of green vestments to emphasize that we are a pilgrim Church in process of growth. However, on occasion, Ordinary Time is punctuated with the celebration of a special feast on Sunday with the use of white vestments as a sign of special joy for Jesus, Mary or a Saint. Always, we feed upon the Word and Sacrament at each Liturgy. The wisdom of the Hebrew Scriptures, the teachings of the Apostles in the Epistles, and the preaching of the Kingdom of God by Christ in the Gospels are proclaimed to nurture us. Eucharist is the source and summit of our life and nourishment. The use of flowers, song and music complement the liturgy. In Ordinary Time we are always between the major seasons of the Church year. Our Theme throughout all of Ordinary Time is "Thy Kingdom Come!"

JUNE 20TH - THE IMMACULATE HEART OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY: In the midst of the Second World War Pope Pius XII put the whole world under the special protection of our Savior's Mother by consecrating it to her Immaculate Heart, and in 1944 he decreed that in the future the whole Church should celebrate the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is not a new devotion. In the seventeenth century, St. John Eudes preached it together with that of the Sacred Heart; in the nineteenth century, Pius VII and Pius IX allowed several churches to celebrate a feast of the Pure Heart of Mary. Pius XII instituted today's feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary for the whole Church, so as to obtain by her intercession "peace among nations, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue" (Decree of May 4, 1944).
