SEE THE HOLY SPIRIT

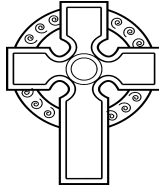
In the readings on Pentecost Sunday, the Spirit is described as a driving wind and tongues of fire. Knowing that the Holy Spirit is a Person of the Trinity, we seem to be able to picture the Spirit only in terms of what the Spirit does. In our second reading, Paul tries to explain just that. Though the English translation sounds vague, let's jump in.

First, Paul says that we cannot know Jesus as Lord without the Spirit. The Spirit is the way Jesus is present today, so anyone who truly believes in Jesus is guided by the Spirit. The Spirit never contradicts Jesus, so anyone claiming to have new knowledge that is opposed to what Jesus taught is not using the Spirit. So, for example, if someone starts a cult that teaches that we no longer need to love our enemies, we know that the Spirit is not in them.

Second, Paul acknowledges that the Spirit works in many ways. As examples, he mentions there are many different gifts and services in the church. He emphasizes that all these differences come from one and the same God. Even today we see this happening; people serve the Church in different ways and with different abilities. People even have different ways of looking at things. Some have more patience than others, some are better listeners, and some are great organizers. The point is that all these differences come from the same source, God.

When we think of the strength of the Church, we usually think of its unity, i.e., one baptism, one faith, one Lord. But we also draw strength from the diversity of gifts and services that people offer to God. No one person can do all it takes to bring the world to Christ. Even Jesus shared his work of spreading the gospel with his disciples. If sin brought a multitude of problems to the world, then the Spirit brings a multitude of gifts to help us through these problems. As Paul says, this diversity of gifts is all part of one Body of Christ. So look at the gifts of those around you, and you may be able to see the Holy Spirit more clearly.

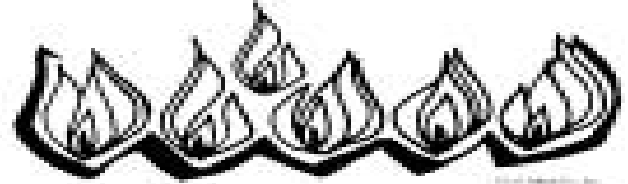

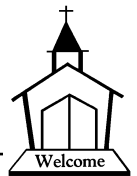

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Knights of Columbus, Council 6322

I am very grateful to have been given the opportunity to represent council 6322 at our annual state convention held this year in San Diego. Pete Comerford and David Rich also went down south to represent our council and district. The theme this year was "A Time for Generosity and Courage."

The celebrant for the opening day Mass was the Most Reverend Oscar A. Solis, Bishop of Salt Lake City. He talked to all of us about strengthening our family life spiritually and supporting a strong parish community. About 1000 Knights were in attendance, traveling in from all corners of the state.

A few fun facts about our organization.....

The Knights donated \$175,000,000 this year to various charities.

The Knights contributed 73,000,000 hours to community and parish activities.

There are roughly 2 million men who make up the Knights of Columbus Worldwide.

In California alone, \$738,000 was raised for people with intellectual disabilities.

A little History...

Monsignor Hayes Council number 6322 was initiated in Placerville, California on January 6, 1972. The name of the council was chosen to honor Msgr. Hayes, who was pastor at Saint Patrick for many years, and was well-liked in the community. At the time of the council's organization, Brother Frank Weigel and Murray Rasmussen were on the district council formation team. After obtaining a list of all local Knights, they contacted them for transfer to the newly formed council.

MISSIONARY COOPERATIVE APPEAL



The Missionary Cooperative Appeal is an annual program in which missionaries from around the world speak at each parish. The goal of this appeal is to increase awareness of missionary work and to raise funds to help missionary organizations continue their evangelization efforts in the Diocese of Sacramento, 51 different missions were selected this year to each speak at two parishes. Last year through generous donations, we collected \$426,500 for 48 missions.

On the weekend of June 17th and 18th, our parish will be visited by Olympia V. Nunez with the Diocese of Leon, Nicaragua. She will share with us their courageous evangelization efforts on behalf of the Catholic Church and give us an opportunity to support their work in the field. A second collection will be taken up following her presentation. All funds collected throughout the Diocese will be equally divided among the 51 missionary organizations visiting the Diocese of Sacramento this year. Thank you in advance for your generosity.
