

REFLECTION

Thank God for Mercy

After hearing Jesus tell a story contrasting a devout believer and a tax collector, after hearing the self-satisfied boasting of the believer, and after listening to Jesus' assessment of people who talk themselves up while putting others down, it would be all-too-easy to offer a critique of our own. Thank God we are not like the tax collector ... and thank God we are devout in only the right ways!



The irony, though, is that this puts the same self-congratulatory words on our lips and reveals the same condescending spirit in our heart. This spirit goes beyond our attitude in prayer. How quickly and easily we look

down on others and judge them for any number of things: their appearance, the way they raise their children, their failure to reach our definition of the good life in any number of ways. So many things that make us thankful we are not like them. Is anyone immune to the Pharisee's heart and spirit? No. It catches us all. This is why the Scriptures regularly and often caution us against judging others.

A person is not devout if he is so full of himself there is no room left for God. But the tax collector's prayer rises out of his awareness of an emptiness only God can fill: "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." To focus on God's goodness, not our own, is what it means to humble ourselves. Praying with the tax collector, we recognize our need for God's mercy to fill our lives so that, in turn, it can flow through us to others.

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18

God is just and does not show favoritism, but hears the prayers of everyone. Anyone who serves God, no matter how lowly his position here on earth, will be heard and answered.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

Paul writes to Timothy that he thinks his mission is near the end, and he is glad his faith is still strong. Paul hopes that all nations will hear the gospel. But, if he is executed as he anticipates, he is sure he will live forever in heaven.

Gospel: Luke 18:9-14

Jesus tells a parable about a Pharisee who went to the temple, and offered up a prayer of thanks because he was not a sinner like the tax collector who was also there to pray. The tax collector was far more humble, acknowledging his sins, and asking forgiveness for them. Jesus said the tax collector's prayer would be heard because, "Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, while he who humbles himself will be exalted."


