

Each week select one activity from the following to complete. Samples of each activities are also listed.

Activity 1: Drawing – Geometric Forms

-Materials: White Paper, Pencil, Eraser, Ruler, Color Pencils

-Directions: (started in class, but did not get a chance to finish)

- 1.) Recall the value chart you created and the 3-Dimensional Shapes we began to draw. Cone, cylinder, sphere, and cube.
- 2.) You are to sketch each shape at least one time. Some may be behind another shape or parts may be off the paper.
- 3.) Draw a horizontal line from left to right. Do not let the line cross on top of the shape. This will give the appearance that your shapes are sitting on a tabletop.
- 4.) To make the forms have a realistic appearance, apply the shading technique in each shape with color pencils. Remember to keep the same light source on all shape. Ex: If it is on right, the lightest side will be on the right of each shape.
- 5.) To create a shadow, keep in mind of the darkest side of your form. This is where you shall place the shadow.
- 6.) Color the tabletop and background. Also recall the light source. Where are the lightest and darkest side?

Activity 2: Collage – Roll a Picasso

-Materials: Construction Papers, Pencil, Eraser, Ruler, Scissors, Crayons, 1 Dice, Worksheet, Glue

-Directions:

- 1.) You will need 1 regular-sized construction paper and 3-4 others cut in squares or rectangles (or mixed) of different sizes. You may select the color of construction papers.
- 2.) Using the worksheet, roll the dice. Based on the number, the face you were given in crayons on the regular-sized paper. Set aside.
- 3.) Roll dice to select an eye (or eyes) from the worksheet. Draw eye(s) on individual small construction papers.
- 4.) Repeat previous step for nose and mouth.
- 5.) With your pieces of small construction papers, arrange them on the face however you want. Once you are satisfied, glue them down.

Activity 3: Drawing – Mandalas

-Materials: 2 White Paper, Construction Paper, Pencil, Eraser, Black Marker, Color Pencils, Scissors, Glue

-Additional Material: Compass

-Directions: (Radial Symmetry-Repeating shapes and patterns evenly from the center outward.)

- 1.) A compass would make things slightly easier, but it manageable with a pencil and eraser. Draw 4-5 concentric circles in the center of paper. It will be like a Target logo.
- 2.) Start from the center, you are to create a pattern all the way around in each individual ring. This will be how you form a radial symmetry. Use pencil first and sketch lightly.
- 3.) Trace over pencil marks with a black marker. Use the tip of the marker to create a thin line (do not push down).
- 4.) Color in using color pencils.
- 5.) Cut out and glue on construction paper. Your choice of color.

Activity 4: Drawing – One-Point Perspective Landscape

-Materials: White Paper, Pencil, Eraser, Black Crayon, Watercolor Paints, Paintbrush, Water, Paper Towel

-Additional Materials: Placemat, Apron or T-Shirt

-Directions:

- 1.) Place paper vertically.
- 2.) Draw a horizontal line on the lower half of the paper. This is your horizon line.
- 3.) From the bottom corners, draw two diagonal lines that connects to the horizon line in the middle. Keep a very small space in between. This is the road.
- 4.) Almost in the middle of the bottom side, draw two lines close to together that connect into one as they touch the horizon line. This is the line that divides the road.
- 5.) On the left and right side of the road, draw two large trees. It may cut off the paper. They will be slightly close to the corners.
- 6.) Draw two more smaller trees, one on each side. They will appear to behind the bigger trees.
- 7.) Add two or four more trees, even on each side. These are the smallest trees. The idea is that the further away an object is from you the smaller it looks.
- 8.) Draw some mountains in the distance and clouds or stars in the sky for your background.
- 9.) Carefully color with watercolor paints. Set aside to dry when done.

Activity 5: Origami – Fox

-Materials: Orange Construction Paper, Pencil, Eraser, Ruler, Scissors, Black Marker

-Directions:

- 1.) Cut construction paper into a perfect square. Preferably 6" x 6". Remember to measure all around before cutting.
- 2.) Place square in a diamond position and fold in half horizontally (top corner to bottom corner). Open and fold in half vertically (left corner to right corner). Be sure to line up the corners correctly.
- 3.) Keep paper fold vertically. The triangle should be pointing to the right. Fold top corner to the center. Repeat with bottom corner. It will look like a smaller diamond.
- 4.) Fold top triangle to the back in half. You will have an upside-down triangle.
- 5.) Fold the top 2 right corner diagonally.
- 6.) Fold the corner of the middle flap to the center. Unfold and carefully open the middle flap to point the corner down. You will now see the face and ears.
- 7.) The opposite corner fold inward to create the tail.
- 8.) With a black marker, draw in the details (eyes and nose). You may use glue to secure your piece from unfolding.
