

Each week select one activity from the following to complete. Samples of each activities are also listed.

Activity 1: Origami – Owl

-Materials: White Paper, Pencil, Color Pencils, Markers, Scissors

-Directions:

- 1.) Cut out a circle.
- 2.) Fold in the right and left side of the circles. These will form the wings.
- 3.) Bend down the top of the circle. This will be the head.
- 4.) Cut out or draw details like eyes, beak, feet, feathers, etc. Glue pieces onto the owl.

Activity 2: Tempera Painting – Flowers Bouquet for Mom

-Materials: White Paper, Tempera Paint, Paintbrush, Scissors, Green Pipe Cleaners or Popsicle Sticks, Ribbon, Stapler or Glue

-Additional Materials: Placemat, Apron or T-Shirt

-Directions: (Parent assistance)

- 1.) Carefully paint one hand either red, pink, or your mom's favorite color. Keep hand close and place on paper. Repeat at least three times. These will be your rose bud. Wash hands for the next step.
- 2.) Carefully paint your thumb green. Place thumb at the bottom of the hand painting and outline. This will be the leaves holding your rose bud together. Repeat as necessary. Set aside to dry, approximately 10 minutes. Wash hands for next step.
- 3.) When dry, cut out your hand roses.
- 4.) If using pipe cleaners, staple hand rose and tie together with a ribbon. If using popsicle sticks, color green with marker before gluing hand rose.

Activity 3: Drawing – Name Monster Buddy

-Materials: White Paper, Pencil, Eraser, Scissors, Markers or Crayons

-Directions:

- 1.) Fold paper in half.
- 2.) Keep paper folded and write you name in big letters on one side. Be sure the folded edge is on the bottom with the opening on top.
- 3.) Sketch a big, lumpy bubble that wraps around your name and connects to the bottom edge of the paper.
- 4.) Cut around the bubble and open.

5.) With your name facing the back, you will have a unique shape. Think of a monster you can sketch out of your new shape. How many eyes, arms, feet?

6.) When you are done sketching, color in your monster with markers or crayons.

Activity 4: Collage – Picasso Portrait

-Materials: Construction Papers, Pencil, Eraser, Scissor, Glue

-Directions:

- 1.) Select at least four colors of construction papers.
- 2.) One construction paper will be your background.
- 3.) With the other three construction papers, you will draw and cut out the head, eyes, mouth, ears, hair, and accessories (hat, glasses, bow, etc.). Use the different colors for each piece.
- 4.) Once you have your pieces, arrange them on your first construction paper before gluing.

Activity 5: Free Draw Challenge – What can the Dot be?

-Materials: White Paper, Pencil, Eraser, Markers, Crayons, Color Pencils

-Directions:

- 1.) Ask a family member to help you draw a dot. Any size, any color, and anywhere on your page.
- 2.) With this dot, you are to turn it into a drawing. You cannot ignore the dot. It needs to be part of your drawing somehow. Ex: It can be a balloon, flower, ball, etc.
- 3.) Sketch out your idea first. Use the whole page!
- 4.) Color in with markers, crayons, and/or color pencils.
