First Reading: ISAIAH TELLS US THAT WHEN CHRIST COMES, THE WEAK WILL BE MADE STRONG, THE DEAF WILL HEAR, THE BLIND WILL SEE, AND ABOVE ALL, "SORROW AND MOURNING WILL FLEE."

MANY HANDS MAKE FOR A SPECIAL THANKSGIVING

Now that Thanksgiving has passed it is time to write a note of thanks to all who made this Thanksgiving so special. Two weeks before Thanksgiving I had doubts that we could meet the needs of all those who requested baskets this year. Fortunately, I found I had no need to worry.

The economy, though in better condition than previous years, has slowed recently, leaving many families to continue their struggle to make ends meet. However, our Parish Family came through once again. Many people called the rectory to find out what foods were in short supply. The PBA brought us 18 turkeys and 9 hams. People of the parish came through again and shopped to provide more than enough turkeys for our baskets. Food also came from Jefferson Recreation, the Lake Hopatcong Foundation, and Little Learner Academy, who between them came up with 25 boxes of food. We also received 15 baskets of food and turkeys from Pope John High School and many bags of canned goods from Girl Scout Troop #111. Many, many, people made this all happen.

On Sunday, November 20th, our eighth grade Religious Education students and catechists had plenty of food to fill all 55 baskets, and distributed about 20 that day. Turkeys were dropped off as late as November 22nd, the second day of distribution.

The people who helped to distribute the baskets did a wonderful job and I want to thank them by name. They were: Ed Young, Jeanne Monaghan, Marilyn Di Gennaro, as well as Debbie Ferguson from Hurdtown Methodist Church. They also helped us finish the Christmas mailing.

The Thanksgiving Baskets are organized through the Religious Education Program in coordination with our food pantry, and I want to give a special thank you to Susan Lavin, Jaye Hedrick and Toni Tarighi for their tireless efforts in ensuring that the project went off as planned. I thank all those who donated money towards our gift certificates and all those who dropped off food and turkeys.

Through the generosity of so many people fifty seven families enjoyed a special Thanksgiving in our area, and we will be able to assist Hurdtown Methodist with their Christmas baskets in addition to helping Ed Young with a winter dinner at the Soup Kitchen in Dover.

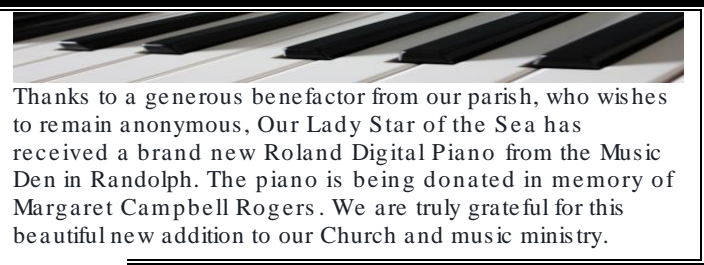
