SCRIPTURES

July 16, 2017– 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Just as the rain and snow water the earth and make it fruitful, so does the word of God bring forth good seed. (ISAIAH 55: 10-11)

TURNING TO GOD

It has become so easy to get distracted and pulled from our course, our focus. With the troubled times we are all faced with, coupled with our own trials and tribulations, we tend to forget to turn to God for help.

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest...for my yoke is easy, and my burden light." Matthew 11:28-30 reaffirms to us that God's help is here for the taking when we are tired and overburdened, helpless and hopeless. As nations, communities and individuals struggling not only to keep true to religious, public and humanitarian obligations, the burden the Bible speaks of does not end here, but also includes the struggle of personal success, as we try to compete with the demands of the world today.

In stressful situations, the best thing we can do is to turn to God for His wisdom. Ask the Holy Spirit for decisiveness. Assure ourselves in times of weakness that we have strength, just as Jesus did while carrying out the will of the Father. God knows what we're dealing with.
