### SCRIPTURES

#### August 6TH –Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**First Reading:** WITH GREAT ENTHUSIASM AND FERVOUR, GOD URGES HIS PEOPLE TO COME TO HIM AND TO ACCEPT THE GIFTS HE EXTENDS TO THEM. (ISAIAH 55:1-3)

**SECOND READING:** IN WORDS THAT ARE STIRRING AND COURAGEOUS, PAUL EXCLAIMS THAT NOTHING WILL SEPARATE HIM AND HIS FOLLOWERS FROM THE LOVE OF CHRIST—NEITHER TRIAL—PERSECUTION—NOR DEATH. (ROMANS 8:35, 37-39)

**GOSPEL:** MATTHEW GIVES US A STRAIGHTFORWARD AND CONVINCING ACCOUNT OF THE MIRACLE OF THE LOAVES AND FISHES. BECAUSE THE CROWDS FOLLOWING JESUS WERE HUNGRY, HE TOOK FIVE LOAVES AND TWO FISH, BLESSED THEM, AND GAVE THEM TO THE CROWDS. ALTHOUGH THE PEOPLE NUMBERED ABOUT FIVE THOUSAND, THERE WAS STILL FOOD REMAINING. (Matthew 14: 13-21)

# LIFT YOUR SAILS

Driving around the parish and town each day, I get a few glimpses of the lake from the road. One of my favorite sights is that of the sailboat gliding along over the calm blue waters. This image has become a very meaningful one in my own spiritual journey. It reminds me that the challenge of being a follower of Christ today calls us to "lift our sails" meaning that each of us has something special to do with our lives. We are called to pull up the anchors that we have put in place and respond to Christ's invitation to "Follow Him."

Jesus invites us to set out on our journey aware that He will always be with us and we need to only keep "our sails up" so that the Holy Spirit can fill them. He continually reaches out to us and offers us numerous opportunities to respond. We just need to listen to His invitation – one which comes to us via the events, people and circumstances of our lives. When we lift our sails and pull up our anchors God will carry us through the storms we encounter in life and lead us to a safe harbor. The Spirit will fill our sails with a fresh breeze and enable us to behold the beauty of the lake, the skies, the stars and even life itself.

Let us remember that "the winds of God's grace are always blowing," but we must make the effort to raise the sails.

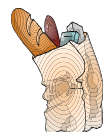

**MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN:** The Diocese of Paterson participates in this special plan to help Missionary Congregations especially in Africa, South America, and India. Each parish is asked to help a specific community through the Missionary Cooperation Plan. **The weekend of Aug. 19-20**, our parish will host **Sr. Jacinta Kimaro**, from the Congregation of The Evangelizing Sisters of Mary. It is a missionary African Congregation located in Tanzania-Zanzibar, Kenya, Uganda, Sudan, Cuba and South America. They work in the arid desert lands, in war torn areas, and in the most remote places. The Evangelizing Sisters of Mary work directly with single parents, desperate drop-out youth, street children, refugees, people living in slums, and those affected with HIV/Aids. The sisters do manual labor to help small generating projects by gardening, selling food, cooking, and doing carpentry work. They also help pay tuition and medical bills for this population, so that the children can at least receive a high school education. Your generous support and prayers will help the work of the Evangelizing Sisters of Mary. **The Second Collection on August 19-20 will be for this purpose.** Please welcome Sr. Jacinta.
