SCRIPTURES:

June 10th- Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: GOD ASKED ADAM WHY HE ATE THE FRUIT FROM THE FORBIDDEN TREE. ADAM BLAMES HIS COMPANION, WHO IN TURN BLAMES A SERPENT. GOD THEN TOLD THE SERPENT IT WOULD BE BANNED FROM OTHER ANIMALS, AND BE AN ENEMY OF HUMANITY. (GENESIS 3: 9-15)

SECOND READING: PAUL DESCRIBES OUR BELIEF THAT "HE WHO RAISED UP THE LORD JESUS WILL RAISE US UP ALONG WITH JESUS." ALTHOUGH OUR BODIES GROW WEAKER, EACH DAY OUR INNER STRENGTH GROWS. PAUL ALSO DESCRIBES OUR BURDENS AS LIGHT WHEN COMPARED TO THE ETERNAL REWARDS WE CAN ATTAIN. (II CORINTHIANS 4: 13-5:1)

GOSPEL: SOME OF THE SCRIBES FELT THAT JESUS WAS POSSESSED AND CLAIMED THAT HE EXPELLED DEMONS WITH HELP FROM SATAN. JESUS SILENCED THEM BY ASKING, "HOW CAN SATAN EXPEL SATAN?" JESUS ALSO WARNED THEM THAT ALTHOUGH MANY SINS WOULD BE FORGIVEN, BLASPHEMY AGAINST THE HOLY SPIRIT WOULD NOT. JESUS WAS THEN TOLD THAT HIS MOTHER, BROTHER AND SISTERS WERE ASKING FOR HIM. HE ASKED, "WHO ARE MY MOTHER AND BROTHER AND SISTERS? WHOEVER DOES THE WILL OF GOD IS BROTHER AND SISTER AND MOTHER TO ME." THIS DEMONSTRATES JESUS' DEEP LOVE FOR ALL THOSE WHO LOVE GOD. (MARK 3: 20-35)

This is also our "pot luck picnic" and last meeting before our summer break.

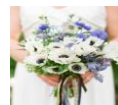

CORPUS CHRISTI

The Catholic Church is a custodian of the mysteries of God. Last weekend we celebrated one of those mysteries, The Holy Trinity. Today we celebrate another mystery, The Eucharist, or we celebrate one particular aspect of the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ or Corpus Christi. The name "Eucharist" – meaning "thanksgiving"- refers to the fact that at its institution, Christ "gave thanks" and also that this action is the supreme act of Christian gratitude to God. There are accounts of the institution of the Eucharist in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians, Chapter 11: 23-33, and also in Matthew, Mark and Luke.

The Church continually reminds us of the central role that the celebration of the Eucharist holds in our lives. It is in coming together as a community of faith around the Eucharistic table that not only do we express our faith but also we grow in solidarity and in our ability to express our faith. It is our active participation in this great prayer of the church that continues to remind us of the great challenge we face in living out the Gospel. It is only when we have taken part in the Penitential Rite, listened to God's word in the readings and Homily, and witnessed the changing of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ that we can approach the Table of the Lord to receive His Body and Blood.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is one way in which the church reminds us of the great mystery that we celebrate today. Literally "Corpus Christi" means "Body of Christ" and was the phrase that the priest used as he distributed Communion before the Mass was celebrated in English. The change into English from Latin came about in 1970.

This Feast began to be celebrated in Liege- present day Belgium- in 1246 and Pope Urban IV extended it to the whole church in 1264. It was referred to back then as the Feast of the Blessed Sacrament.

Body of Christ: The church itself is also called The Body of Christ. It is the extension here on earth of Jesus, Himself. While we may receive the "Body of Christ"- Jesus- in Communion, we are still quite a way from being the "Body of Christ."

As members of a Christian community of faith each of us is called to be a healer, reconciler, teacher, guide, forgiver. We fall short of that challenging task each week. This is why we begin each liturgy with the Penitential Rite. We acknowledge the fact that we are sinners. That reality will not change, but gathering around the Table of the Lord should help us to continue to become more fully the "Body of Christ."
