SCRIPTURES:

November 4th Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Moses commands the people to love and fear GOD, AND ALWAYS KEEP THE COMMANDMENTS THAT THEY WERE GIVEN. HE TELLS THEM TO OBSERVE ALL STATUTES SO THAT THEY WILL CONTINUE TO GROW AND PROSPER, AND TELLS THEM THAT THEY MUST LOVE GOD WITH ALL THEIR SOULS AND STRENGTH. (DEUTERONOMY 6: 2-6)

SECOND READING: UNDER THE OLD COVENANT THERE WERE MANY PRIESTS, BUT JESUS WILL NOW REMAIN HIGH PRIEST FOREVER BECAUSE HE WILL LIVE, FOREVER, AND ALWAYS BE AVAILABLE TO THOSE WHO WANT TO BE SAVED. HE DOES NOT NEED TO OFFER SACRIFICE EVERY DAY FOR THE SINS OF HIS PEOPLE, BECAUSE HE OFFERED HIMSELF UP IN PAYMENT FOR THEIR SINS. (HEBREWS 7: 23-28)

GOSPEL: ONE OF THE SCRIBES ASKED JESUS WHICH COMMANDMENT IS THE FIRST, AND HE REPLIED THAT THE FIRST IS TO LOVE AND HONOR THE LORD AND NO ONE ELSE. JESUS EXPLAINED THAT THEY MUST LOVE GOD WITH ALL THEIR HEART. AND LOVE THEIR NEIGHBOR. THE SCRIBE AGREED THAT LOVING GOD COMPLETELY AND LOVING ONE'S NEIGHBOR IS BETTER THAN ANY SACRIFICE THEY COULD MAKE. (Mark 12: 28-34)



CELEBRATING ALL SAINTS & ALL SOULS

On the first two days of November, the Church invites us to reflect that we are part of a faith tradition which builds on the lives of earlier generations. We celebrate our known and unknown ancestors whose handing on of the faith from generation to generation is responsible for our faith today.

In the Apostle's Creed we profess our belief in the Communion of Saints. We believe that through our Baptism all people are called to be saints. We believe that the saints in heaven can intercede for us; that the souls in purgatory will eventually enter heaven and that our prayers can help them get there. We believe that there is a communion among all these groups - the saints in heaven, the souls in purgatory and those of us still living on earth. The Communion of Saints offers us a vision of Christian hope in our world today.

The Feast of All Saints recalls the Catholic tradition of looking to the saints as models and intercessors for us on our faith journey. Pope John Paul II called them the Church's "greatest treasure." They were people who experienced the same feelings of love, joy, suffering, doubt and hope that we do today. They loved God and placed the message of the Gospel first in their lives. We recall the lives of the saints because we can learn from them how to face the up's and down's of our daily lives with the same love and trust in a Loving Father. For just as they walked in the footsteps of Jesus, so also can we.

The commemoration of All Souls Day reminds us that the life of those who are faithful to the Lord is but changed not ended by their passing from this life. Death is a reality we all face; a mystery we confront. As believing Christians we rejoice in Christ's triumph over death and remember those who have gone before us with the sign of faith and who now rest in His presence.

This week we honor and remember all those men and women who faithfully followed the Gospel and call upon them to intercede for us as we continue our Faith Journey.

May we also be grateful for those who have gone before us and who helped to establish and strengthen our Community of Faith here at Our Lady Star of the Sea. *Sincerely in Christ,*
