SCRIPTURES:

NOVEMBER 17th– 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: THE PROPHET MALACHI WARNED THAT THE TIME WOULD COME WHEN ALL THE EVIL PEOPLE WOULD BE PUNISHED. HE THEN SPEAKS OF THE ARRIVAL OF "THE SUN OF JUSTICE, WITH ITS HEALING RAYS," BELIEVED BY MOST TO MEAN JESUS. **(MALACHI 3: 19-20a)**

SECOND READING: SOME OF THE THESSALONIANS CLAIMED CHRIST'S RETURN WAS IMMINENT, SO THEY STOPPED WORKING AND ASKED OTHERS FOR FOOD. PAUL DESCRIBES HIS WILLINGNESS TO WORK, SO THAT HE WOULD NOT IMPOSE ON OTHERS. HE ENCOURAGES THEM TO FOLLOW HIS EXAMPLE AND EARN THEIR OWN LIVING. **(2 THESSALONIANS 3: 7-12)**

GOSPEL: JESUS WARNS OF THE PERSECUTION ALL CHRISTIANS WILL FACE BECAUSE OF HIM, AND HOW SOME WILL EVEN BE PUT TO DEATH. YET HE SAYS THEY WILL NOT BE HARMED BECAUSE "BY PATIENT ENDURANCE YOU WILL SAVE YOUR LIVES." IF JESUS' FOLLOWERS ARE LOYAL, THEY WILL BE RESURRECTED AND THEIR SUFFERING END. **(Luke 21: 5-19)**

Father Ed Dillon - Man of Faith

Fr. Edward Dillon was born in New York City on Feb. 8th, 1943 and grew up in Brooklyn with his two brothers, William and John. The family was very active at St. Ephrem Catholic Church on Bay Ridge Parkway in Brooklyn. After High School, Fr. Ed was accepted into the John Jay College of Criminal Justice and after graduation from there he joined the New York City Police Dept. and worked in the 72nd Precinct. He was a police officer with dedication and integrity and served for twenty years.

During his time as a police officer Fr. Ed received three Master's degrees in Theology and History from Columbia and Fordham. He was a great reader and life long student of history. After retiring from the NYPD he answered the call to priesthood and applied to the Diocese of Paterson. Bishop Rodimer accepted him as a seminarian in 1984 and he was ordained to the priesthood on November 26, 1988. As a priest of our diocese he served at St. Joseph's Church, Lincoln Park, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Boonton, Bayley-Ellard High School, Madison and at St. Patrick's, Chatham. He retired from active ministry about ten years ago but made himself available to help out in many parishes in the diocese.

He lived in Pond Eddy, PA for some years but made the commute to various parishes in all kinds of weather. Fr. Ed helped out in this parish on many occasions, especially when I had heart surgery in October 2014. I enjoyed discussing history with him and also sharing family stories. He had a great memory and he shared with me that his great grandfather fought in the Battle of Chancellorsville, VA. in the Civil War. He had some health issues and moved to Madison, NJ in 2016 to be closer to his medical care. Fr. Ed was taken from us suddenly on Saturday, October 26th.

I was able to attend his funeral Mass at St. Patrick's, Chatham on October 30th with Patricia Connolly, Joan McGrady and Rose Rech. I shall miss him as will many parishioners.

May his noble soul rest with the angels.
