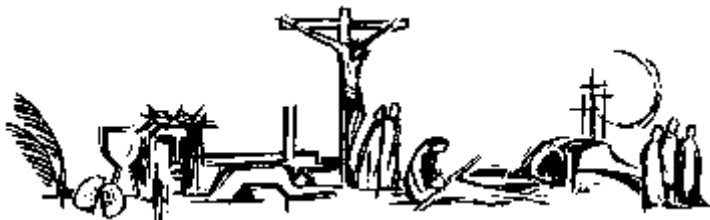

February is Black History month but sensitivity to people of a race different from your own is bigger than just one color. As a family, learn about a race different from your own this month.




Answer Bishop Malooly's Invitation to *Walk His Way*


