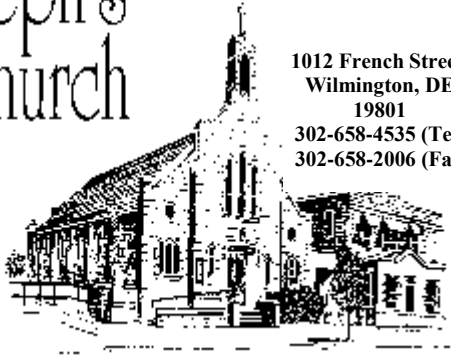

Parish Fund Raising
