THOUGHTS FROM FATHER TED: Last week in the bulletin, I encouraged you to consider some time away--some time for quiet and for prayer. I suggested the possibility of a retreat. I make this recommendation because we easily ignore our spiritual lives. We are less likely to ignore the financial aspects of our lives or our medical needs. We know that our relationship with God is important but, for some reason, does not seem to be urgent. There is always, we think, an opportunity to take care of that at some future time. We would not do that with an overdraft at the bank or report from the doctor that our blood pressure is dangerously high. Please take a moment to think again: first, we have only one life on this earth; secondly, we do not know when it will end; thirdly, our relationship with God while on this earth will determine our eternal future. Is it wise to postpone the only aspect of our lives that will last for all eternity?

I invite you to take time today to evaluate your relationship with God. Do not stop by asking yourself only if you have committed some major (mortal) sin. Instead, ask yourself about the quality of your love for God. Ask if you have tried to grow in that relationship with God. Ask yourself if you are ready to stand before God if you were called from this life today or tomorrow. Finally, ask yourself what changes God is calling upon you to make now. Do not put off working on that change until some future time. None of us know if we will be living on this earth at some future time. All we know is that we are alive at this moment. It is wise to take advantage of this moment and turn our hearts more fully to God.
